National Spelling Bee Competition

The Spelling Bee is organised by 'Routes into Languages, Cymru' and is a yearly competition.

Phoenix Project at Chirk Fire Station

Ysgol Rhiwabon students recently took part in the Phoenix Project at Chirk Fire Station. The project, which is organised by North Wales Fire and Rescue Service, educates 13 to 17 year olds about the importance of fire safety and the consequences of emergencies for the various services.

The Phoenix Project is a great example of a multi-agency approach to encourage positive behaviour among young people. During the five day course young people engage in fire and rescue service activities such as hose running drills, fighting fires and search and rescue. They also learn useful day to day skills such as the consequences of their actions, manual handling, risk management and fire safety.

North Wales Fire and Rescue Service has joined up with North Wales Police to create a film aimed at 10 to 16 year olds to raise awareness of the dangers and consequences of the impact of emergencies in the Wrexham area. The Fire and Rescue Service has a powerful draw for young people and gives the opportunity to try to influence behaviour. Mr Bingham, Assistant Headteacher at Ysgol Rhiwabon said,

"The Phoenix project offers a unique experience to build on qualities such as service, work respect, communication and trust. The week involves a blend of classroom learning where the youngsters are taught safety in the home, then drill yard activity where the Fire Service promotes working together as a team, assessing risk and adhering to instructions. The aim of the course is to assist the youngsters in becoming more motivated and positive about themselves, which in turn has the effect of making them better citizens. We are hoping these young people will feel they have gained something positive from the Phoenix project and feel it will be of benefit to them in the future".











Summer Holiday Programme 2017



We are pleased to be able to offer again the School Holiday Enrichment Programme to all of our Year 6 students. This was a huge success last year when we ran it for the first time.



A reminder please: If your child is ill you should:

- Contact the school on 01978 822392 as soon possible on the first day of absence, preferably before 9.00 am
- Send a note in on the first day they return with an explanation of the absence if you haven't had contact with the school
- If your child is absent we will:
- Call you on the first day of absence if we have not heard from you
- Invite you in to discuss the situation with our Pastoral Support Worker or your child's Lead Learner if an absences persist
- Refer the matter to Hayley Roberts, our Educational Social Worker (ESW) if attendance falls below 85% or if you fail to engage with the support offered by the school

Message Service Change

The school will soon be changing its text message service from Parentmail to a company called 'The Contact Group'.

The new text and email service is branded 'Call Parents' and we have also invested in an additional service for attendance.

As Parent/Guardian you <u>do not have to do</u> <u>anything</u> as all information will automatically be updated.

As currently, if you have changed your mobile or landline telephone number please let school know.

The text message will show up as **RhiwabonSch** on your telephone so you know clearly who it is from.

For attendance the new service will be able to issue a text/email to you to indicate if your child is absent from school and it will allow you to respond directly with the reason for absence.

This will make reporting any absence much quicker and easier for you and is <u>free of charge</u> to you.
