The Lychgate at the entrance to St Mary's Church is the Ruabon Parish Memorial, its dedication took place on the 31st October 1920. The names of those killed in the two world wars are now inscribed on plaques on both sides of the lychgate.

On Sunday 11th there will be a parade from St Mary's School Car Park starting at 10.30am; arriving in time for the dedication. The church bells will ring half-muffled from 10am until the commencement of the Service of Remembrance at 10.45am. The Service of Remembrance at St Mary's Church will start with the laying of the wreaths at the Lychgate at 10.45am. Following the service, Open Bells (bells without muffles) will be rung at 12-30pm. At 4pm in St Mary's Church there will be a service to remember those from the local area who died. This will be a quiet reflective service to remember those who died in WW1 and who lived in the old parish of Ruabon.

In Wrexham, the beacon of light will be lit at 7pm on the top of St. Giles Church.

Friends of Ruabon, have been invited to submit data to show that Ruabon Station is a viable site for investment, in providing: 'Access for All'.

We would like to thank everyone who has responded to the recently distributed 'urgent request', for your thoughts on the difficulties faced by residents of ALL ages, on accessing the two platforms when departing or arriving at the station.

This huge amount of input is key, and shows that residents are connected with and care about what is happening (or not!) in Ruabon.

We will also point out that the building of a supermarket; 360 houses and a hotel has been given the go ahead, which will increase the footfall at the station considerably.

That Ruabon is the recognised 'Gateway' to the World Heritage Site and yet it is the only station on the Shrewsbury line to not to have 'Access for All'.

We are lucky that Susan Elan Jones MP has supported this campaign from the start and that you all responded in your 100s by signing the petitions placed around the village. The number of signatures, were not only by residents but boosted by people further afield who use the station.

Knowing that everyone was so keen, Susan Elan Jones was then able to present the petition to Parliament which has also had the backing of the Welsh Assembly.

We would never have got this far without the determination and backing of so many Ruabon residents.

We have been promised news of the outcome in April 2019.


