Wrexham Churches and Community Cold Weather Shelter

This project runs for 10 weeks during January and February. It provides an



overnight stay for 10 homeless people each night in church halls in the Wrexham area.

St John's Church in Rhosymedre hosts it on a Wednesday night.

The homeless who have booked in, are picked up from Wrexham library and taken to the venue. They have a cooked evening meal and are given a bed for the night. In the morning they have cooked breakfast and are given a packed lunch and taken back into Wrexham.

Volunteers cook, set up the beds and then clear away the next morning. The aim is to give a group of people a chance to eat and sleep safely, and to offer the support they need to turn their lives around.

Natural Resources Wales (NRW)

Has shut down the site managed by Clwyd Breakers Ltd on the Gardden Industrial Estate (off Tatham Road) in Ruabon, in order to stop its further pollution of the local environment by ignoring and breaking the terms of its environmental permit.

This scrapyard has been named as: "one of the worst performing waste sites in Wales" and as a result, has had its permit revoked, which means the site can no longer store or dismantle unusable cars.

The area has now been cleared and no longer poses a threat to the local environment.



Some of the issues raised by NRW officers were:

1. "Visible oil pollution on all parts of the site.
2. Polluting oils and fluids not stored properly.
3. Cars not being de-polluted correctly.
4. No fire prevention plan for the site
5. Waste being stored in the wrong places and without the right infrastructure".

THE NEW WALES & BORDERS RAIL FRANCHISE & TRANSPORT FOR WALES

On October 14th 2018 Transport for Wales commenced operating the Wales & Borders franchise. New logos replaced the Arriva Trains Wales signs at stations and station will undergo deep cleaning and repainting in the new livery colours in the future.

Some of the improvements announced for this line include:

- The introduction of new trains from 2022 which will increase seating capacity and bicycle spaces.
- The weekday service between Shrewsbury and Chester will double in frequency from December 2022
- Sunday service frequency will double from December 2025
- Free wifi will be introduced at stations by December 2020
- Covered cycle storage at all stations
- Installation of ticket vending machines
- Investment at Chester Station to upgrade the concourse, interchange and car park
- Retail enhancement at Chester and Shrewsbury Stations
- Investment in Wrexham General station to improve the multimodal interchange
- Investment in Community Rail Partnerships expanding the current 5 to 12
