## Investment in Learning

Major investment in new ‘flexible learning’ style classrooms at Ysgol Rhiwabon by Wrexham County Council will start to come into use during the coming weeks.

Work has been underway on the first of two new rooms for the school recently with contractors now ready to hand over the first room for use.

The concept of flexible learning spaces will be underpinned by more mobile technology for students who will be able to interact with larger screens, each other and the teacher to generate true interactive learning in an environment that can also be arranged to meet different learning needs.

The gallery of pictures shows the first room prior to renovation through to the initial use by Year 11 in a Maths revision session and aims to show the development of the area with students needs in mind.


Further pictures and updates will be posted on our website as the furniture and IT equipment is delivered.

Mrs Ferron-Evans, Headteacher said:



### PARTNERSHIP NEWS

The first Partnership meeting of 2019 took place at the Guildhall in Wrexham on 19<sup>th</sup> February when funding partners and stakeholders came together.

We are currently working on updating our Terms of Reference and Constitution to reflect the new working partnership with Transport for Wales Rail Services and Network Rail both joining the Partnership Steering Group.

We are guided by the new Community Rail Strategy from the Department for Transport which was revised in late 2018 and the Partnerships 2019/2021 Line Activity Plan reflects the outputs we aim to work as a Partnership to achieve.

Some of the activities planned include:

- Tourism -Stations as Gateways to the wider area or corridor. Capitalising on tourism assets to encourage visitors to stay longer and spend more
- Working with diverse groups Supporting diversity and inclusion through social spaces at stations and promoting healthy and accessible travel
- Refurbishment and renovation of station buildings to promote local employment and economic development
- Cross border collaborative work on joint promotional material

In RUABON NEWS LETTER 244, 8TH OCTOBER 2018,  
it was reported:

**“YESTERDAY (3rd October 2018), ALL THE WORK THAT VOLUNTEERS CARRIED OUT TRANSFORMING A RAGWORT INFESTED FIELD INTO A WILDLIFE FRIENDLY YOUNG WOODLAND AND ORCHARD WAS WIPED OUT.**

**ALL THE TREES WERE PROVIDED VIA A WOODLAND TRUST GRANT AND THE HERITAGE APPLE TREES PROVIDED BY GERAINT HUGHES HAVE GONE.**

**MR BILLINGTON USED A LARGE HEDGE CUTTER TO DESTROY ALL THE SHRUBS AND YOUNG TREES LEAVING NOTHING BUT CHIPPINGS, WITHOUT ANY REGARD TO THE BERRIES THAT WOULD HAVE SUSTAINED WILDLIFE THROUGH THE COMING WINTER.**

**SADLY, THIS DESTRUCTION AND THEFT OF COMMUNITY ASSETS WILL GO UNNOTICED AND UNCHALLENGED BY 98% OF THE COMMUNITY DESPITE THE FACT THAT THEY HAVE TO PAY FOR IT THROUGH THEIR RATES.”**

Since then, it was discovered that there were TWO families who had had trees planted to commemorate their children and other family members.

With this knowledge, Ruabon Community Council was approached on behalf of the families and two trees (chosen by each family) have been purchased, and paid for by the Chair of the RCC: Dana Davies and planted with great care by Bill Smith.

## Time Out for Children with Special Needs

Parents of children with special educational needs often feel isolated and frustrated that 'standard parenting advice' sometimes doesn't work.



The course provides an opportunity for you to support and encourage each other, helping you share feelings and experiences, and come up with solutions to problems on the basis of what works - not what's meant to work!

The seven sessions are written by parents and professionals with input from many different families with experience of children with special needs. They aim to help support you in meeting your child's needs, focussing on children aged between 3 to 11 years with a disability or special needs, particularly those who have learning, developmental and behavioural issues.

### **How does it work?**

Sharing ideas with other parents and carers is a key element. Discussions are based around real-life scenarios. Each session includes space to plan any changes you want to make in your parenting and from week 2, an opportunity to discuss how that's working.

### **What's in it?**

We start by looking at what life is really like living with your child who has special needs, helping them reach their potential and how to keep going. We consider how to boost self-esteem through play and learning, respond with good listening and how our parenting style affects our children's responses.

Next we explore how you can talk to your child about their condition, other people's reactions to your child and recognising and coping with feelings.

Why do our children act the way they do? We look at the many reasons behind behaviour, the vital subject of setting boundaries, why children need them and why they can be hard to set. Following on from this is the value of routines, praise, and consistency and exploring a toolkit of discipline strategies.

Home and school are often big issues and we look at how the school might support your child's learning, how you can play a part in this and where to look for further support. Finally, there's a chance to recognise the impact on the wider family and to review what the course has meant to you.

In keeping with the ethos of the weekly Live Music Showcase concerts, the Wrexham Music Festival will provide a platform for young and emerging talent to showcase their musical abilities and perform in front of a live audience.

Initially, for this inaugural year, we will be promoting 2 age categories. Under 12 years and 13 to 18 years, across 6 classes of musical performance:

Keyboard, Brass, Vocal, Strings (Violin, Viola, Cello, Double Bass, Harp and Guitar), Woodwind and Percussion.

The age qualifying date for both age categories is 31st August 2019. Applicants must be resident in Wrexham County Borough Council or in full time education in the Borough. Participants in the U12 age group will be required to perform a 6 minute recital. Participants in the 13-18 age group will be required to perform a 9 minute recital of contrasting pieces.

The closing date for entry is 5pm on Friday 22nd March 2019 and entries must be submitted in a sealed envelope addressed to: Wrexham Music Festival 2019, Shop/Siop, Tŷ Pawb, Market Street, Wrexham. LL13 8BB. Participants can enter multiple categories if they so wish, however, their programme must be unique to each category.

### A NEW EXHIBITION FOR MARCH:

The *Gresford Craft Group* started up almost 40 years ago and have continued to meet weekly since. There are over 100 members divided between a morning and evening group. The group holds an exhibition each June jointly with *Wrexham Quilting Circle*. There is an exhibition held annually in June in *All Saints Church Gresford* and *Gresford Memorial Hall*. The four day event attracts almost 1000 visitors and raises in excess of £6000 all of which is donated to Charity, divided between *Nightingale House Hospice*, *All Saints Church Gresford*, *Gresford Memorial Hall* and 3 local charities nominated by members of the group.

*Wrexham Quilting Circle* is affiliated to the *Quilters Guild* and has 40 members who meet monthly. The group enjoys group projects and most years produce a quilt which is raffled as part of the exhibition fundraising effort. Meetings include mini workshops and work on individual projects sharing skills in a social setting .

Applications will stay open until March 31 for the new term in September. Wrexham Council will let you know if you have been successful by July 31.

The authority will provide free transport to pupils attending their nearest suitable school when the walking distance is more than two miles for primary pupils or three miles for secondary pupils.
