We made our way back to the hotel for our evening meal and once again headed to the park to play some sports, including a very competitive game of 'Kick Rounders'.




Day 3 in France

One of the sessions at Ysgol Rhiwabon was visited by Welsh Language Commissioner Aled Roberts, himself a former student of Ysgol Rhiwabon.
