

# THE RENEWAL OF RUABON HERITAGE TRAIL



The plan is to start the trail from Ruabon Station, taking in the information board at the Bridge End Inn; passing the Round House; St Mary's Church; The Wynnstay Arms; The Girls' Grammar School; The Alms Houses; Pont Adam Cottages; Pont Adam (the bridge); Plas Newydd; the 'Old School Buildings' of Ruabon Red Brick; 'Offa's Dyke; The Ice House and the Fort.

The monthly meeting of 'Time Well Spent' at the Church Hall, will be one of the ways to record those with background knowledge of the historic points of interest, resulting in a summary of the trail, in the spoken word. This information can then be accessed by a mobile phone through QR (quick response codes) during the tour of Ruabon's Heritage Trail - not only giving more information than could be printed out on the heritage boards, but also marvellous for those with impaired sight.

With all this information (and some help from other members of Friends of Ruabon), Jo has managed to access a grant from AVOW which still had a residue of funds from Entrust for projects such as this. The grant is also sufficient to the cover costs of a company she has identified, to work with her on this project.

# Page one was the good news – now, the not so good news! "SHREWSBURY-CHESTER RAIL USERS ASSOCIATION"

Very many people; adults and students have protested about the removal of the 09.55 (Mondays to Fridays) train from service which runs along the Shrewsbury to Chester rail line (this includes Ruabon).

This decision was made without any consultation, showing a complete lack of respect to stakeholders who were presented with a fait accompli. This alone has shocked those who have worked with the rail companies for years and have still received no satisfactory answer - especially when they were promised an increase in the train services certainly not a reduction.

Now, since attending a meeting last week he does have a few more observations to make:

"Please encourage as many people to write to Ken Skates as possible. He is the one at the centre of this as: The responsible Welsh Minister for Transport and the Environment.

The whole thing has come about because of a requirement put into the franchise by the Welsh Government requiring the operators to run an express between south and north Wales. If I have not told you before, the requirement was that the train leave Cardiff before 07.30 and arrive in Holyhead in less than 4 and a half hours. That is why it cannot stop at our local stations in the morning. Going south in the afternoon there is a bit more 'slack' in the timings.

The message to Ken Skates is that the loss of existing local services to stations in his constituency is unacceptable and that is a direct consequence of the Welsh Government's franchise requirement (as above). It is happening because the train operators do not, at

present, have sufficient rolling stock available to run a shuttle service between Shrewsbury and Chester to run behind the express. Was he informed that this would be the consequence? The only solution is that, until additional rolling stock can be found to maintain the existing level of service, the introduction of the new express service should be delayed. AS MINISTER HE IS IN A POSITION TO ORDER THAT.

Our attention is constantly brought to the need for a reduction in greenhouse gases.

How then, does the move to reduce the local train service in favour of an express train, equate in Ruabon, when planning permission has been given for the building of 350 homes and an hotel on the Aldi site, which is within walking distance of Ruabon Station? Such a move can only force the use of more cars on an already congested part of the A483 and increase parking at Wrexham and Chester.



# News from the Chester to Shrewsbury Rail Partnership Winter 2019 (Ruabon)

The Rail Partnership is part of a nationwide network of community rail partnerships following the Department for Transports

Community Rail Development Strategy and a member of the Association of Community Rail Partnerships.

The Partnership works to deliver an agreed business plan following the DfT strategy and the Wellbeing of Future Generations Act.

The Partnership held their October meeting in the Parish Hall in Chirk and members representing the following organisations were present: Wrexham County Borough Council, Cheshire West & Chester Council, Shropshire Council, Network Rail, Transport for Wales, Transport for Wales Rail Services, British Transport Police, Severn Dee Travel, Cambrian Heritage Railway, Shrewsbury Chester Rail Users Association and the Association of Community Rail Partnerships.

Partners questioned Transport for Wales regarding the December timetable, details of which revealed the proposal to remove two of the services serving our stations (one morning and one afternoon) on weekdays. This was to accommodate the running of a new express Cardiff - Holyhead train.

Transport for Wales Rail Services also gave details of the station improvement programme which is being rolled out and the timetable for the installation of ticket vending machines at stations on this line of route. It is planned to install a machine at Ruabon in December 2020.

The Partnership will meet again in January 2020 in Shrewsbury.
