



#### Wrexham Community support response to Recovery stage from Covid Briefing Sheet update 27th July 2020



#### Easy-access testing for people in communities on the edge of Wrexham town centre (WCBC)



Mobile testing units are being introduced this week to make it easier for people living in communities on the edge of Wrexham town centre to get a Covid-19 test. The easy-access testing facilities will be based in Hightown and Caia Park for several days starting from Wednesday (July 29). As well as making it easier to get a test, the move will help public health experts get a better understanding of the situation in Wrexham. Residents living in these areas are being encouraged to get a test if they think they have symptoms...no matter

how mild. The work is being co-ordinated by Public Health Wales, Wrexham Council and other partners, with support from local voluntary sector organisation AVOW and community groups. Just like in other parts of the country, the testing stations will be managed by the army.

#### Making it easier for people to get tested

Councillor Hugh Jones, Wrexham Council's Lead Member for Communities, Partnerships, Public Protection and Community Safety, says: "We're working with our partners to provide easy-access testing in edge-of-town communities in Wrexham. "As well as making it easier for people to get a test, it will also help Public Health Wales gain further insight into the local situation. "The mobile testing units will be based in Hightown and Caia Park over the next few days, and you can go to either testing station if you live in and around these areas. The process is quick and easy." However, if you feel really unwell, you should still contact your GP as normal (or call 999 if you think there's something seriously wrong). For example, don't try to walk to a testing centre if you're struggling to catch your breath.

#### Even if you have mild symptoms, you should get a test

Dr Chris Williams of Public Health Wales says: "Providing easy-access testing will help us further understand the situation in Wrexham. "We're encouraging anyone who thinks they may have symptoms – even very mild ones – to take advantage of the mobile testing units while they're in the area, and go and get a test. "Testing is a really important part of the strategy for managing Covid-19 in Wales, so it's important people step forward if they think they have symptoms. "Covid-19 can spread in community settings, not just in workplaces. "If you do test positive, you'll be given advice by contact tracers at Wrexham Council. "They'll advise you on how long to isolate for and what support you can get to help you through the isolation period. "They'll also ask for your help in tracing people you've been in close contact with recently."

#### If you're worried about work

A lot of people might be worried about getting a test in case it means they have to isolate and can't go to work. Councillor Hugh Jones says: "People need to pay bills and put food on the table, and it's understandable that many will worry about testing positive and having to miss work. "However, a lot of people may be able to get financial support <a href="https://gov.wales/financial-support-for-individuals">https://gov.wales/financial-support-for-individuals</a> and the council and its partners will help people access this information."

#### Let's keep Wrexham safe and well

Councillor Jones adds: "If you think you have symptoms – no matter how mild – please take advantage of the easy access testing in Hightown and Caia Park later this week. "Public Health Wales, the council and our partners are here to support you. Let's help keep Wrexham, our families and communities safe and well. "It's also important to remember that coronavirus hasn't gone away, and we all still have a vital role to play in preventing its spread by sticking to social distancing guidelines and staying two metres away from others, as well as washing our hands regularly."

#### Where and when you can get a test

The mobile testing centres will be at Caia Park Health Centre on Prince Charles Road, and at a location in Hightown yet to be finalised, from Wednesday, July 29. We'll confirm the location in Hightown as soon as possible. You can just turn-up between 8am and 7pm. It's safe, simple and easy.

#### Other ways to get a test

You can also apply for a test online or by phone. https://gov.wales/apply-coronavirus-test
Take a look at the Welsh Government website for more info. Remember...if you feel really unwell, you should still contact your GP as normal (or call 999 if you think there's something seriously wrong).

#### **Test Trace Protect – TTP**

The Wales response to testing is Test Trace and Protect which is regularly called TTP. The system is only going to be effective if anyone who is contacted by a Tracer follows the instructions and if appropriate isolate for 14 days- people will only be contacted if someone who has tested positive has provided details of those they have been in contact with and locations that they have visited with someone identified as being in close proximity and at risk of the transmission of Covid. You will not be told who the person is that has proved positive.

#### Covid and Flu: Mass vaccination

As if Covid is not enough there are significant concerns about the impact this could have with the usual winter flu outbreaks that occur in varying degrees each year. Discussions are still underway between the Welsh and UK Governments in what a mass vaccination programme would consist of- the latest Welsh Government announcement on the 24th July has stated. The potential for co-circulation of COVID-19 at the same time will make this year's flu vaccination programme even more vital. Alongside extending the programme it's important that those in the existing eligible groups including those aged over 65 years, pregnant women and people with medical conditions are vaccinated first. Increasing uptake in health and social care workers will also be a key priority this season.

This will no doubt be a major step to try and improve the overall, safety of the population and particularly those in vulnerable groups. Details will be emerging over the next few week but currently this is the full statement on the issue. https://gov.wales/wales-announces-largest-ever-flu-vaccine-programme

The latest changes in Wales as part of the lifting of the Covid lockdown restrictions are all part of the phased approach to try and bring some new normality to our lives. The opening of new facilities will come with a number of restrictions and everyone wanting to use these should make contact in advance as many will only be open for people with appointments and limited numbers. Cinemas, museums and beauty salons Face masks on public transport, including taxis, will also be made compulsory for anyone over the age of 11. https://www.bbc.co.uk/news/uk-wales-52631835 Campsites and accommodation with shared facilities can reopen on Saturday.

#### What is changing soon- 16<sup>th</sup> August https://bit.ly/2WUW9si

Shielding- the group of people who have been 'Shielding' because of a variety of medical conditions will be allowed out of their homes from the 16th August. For many this will be a relief but for others their anxiety levels may be so high that they feel that unable to leave their home and may need ongoing support for some of their basic needs such as shopping and prescriptions. The scheme is being 'suspended' as it may well be resumed at any time if the risk factors increase due to the number of cases or spread. The immediate impact will be those that have been in receipt of Welsh Government food parcels will not get one after the 16<sup>th</sup> August. In Wrexham there are approximately 220 people in this category. There will be a very comprehensive letter going to everyone who has previously received a Shielding letter in the next week. The letter contains details of what to do and where to receive help if needed. For Wrexham, the first contact point will be the Council tel 01978 292000.



Playgrounds reopened last Friday in time for children during the school holidays to go out and play https:// news.wrexham.gov.uk/play-areas-due-to-open-tomorrow-24-07-20/ there have been adaptions to the access and some equipment may remain closed. The public are asked to respect the moves the Council have implemented to try and make the facilities as safe as possible. The message is enjoy the facilities but remember social distancing and stay safe.

There has been much confusion over whether a Community Centre/Facilities can open following the First Minister announcement they could from the 20<sup>th</sup> July. The full message regarding open on the 20<sup>th</sup> July is they can but only at the request of a Welsh Government Minister or Local Authority for the express purpose to provide defined Public Services. 

# VOICES OF THE VALLEY - THE FRON MALE VOICE CHOIR

The Fron should have a local concert on the 25th of July at the Stiwt Theatre, Rhosllannerchrugog. It was to be a joint concert with the Lewis Merthyr Band from Porth in the

Rhondda. This pandemic has put a halt to that concert and all the Fron's other concerts up to November. Theatre, Concert Halls and cinemas have been hit hard by the lockdown and the Stiwt has been running a Virtual Audience Appeal. On July 13th they had raised £2,003, 7 days before their target date for raising £1,000. Fron choristers have been helping to publicise the Appeal. At the moment The Fron's November and December concerts are still on, although choir chairman David T Jones said, "I think it's more likely that they have not yet been cancelled. With theatre staff furloughed, getting any information about the venue's plans is difficult and, with the long layoff, the choir will need a few months to get their voices back in shape."

Choir members have been keeping in contact with each other by holding Zoom meetings every Monday and MD Leigh Mason has been holding a Facebook live video rehearsal on Thursday. Also, every Saturday for the past 10 weeks, they have been streaming mini concerts made up of video recordings made live at Competitions or Concerts. They have now exhausted their supply of videos. They may, however, be streaming some audio recording along with a montage of still photos in the coming weeks. They will be on their YouTube channel at 7pm on Saturday nights.

This month, they tried something new - a virtual Choir recording of a song. MD Leigh Mason and accompanist Jason Ellis worked together to produce a video of the accompaniment and of Leigh conducting. This was sent out to each chorister who then videoed themselves singing Gwahoddiad whilst wearing headphones so that they could hear the accompaniment.. They ensured that they all sang at the same speed by watching Leigh conducting. Jason then had the job of stitching all the individual tracks together to create the Virtual Choir Performance.

How could the current situation with COVID -19 virus affect the funeral of my loved one?

# COVID-19 (NOVEL CORONAVIRUS) WCBC PUBLIC BRIEFING NOTE

#### **Key messages**

The North Wales Contact Tracing Service is recruiting people to join teams across the region, including Wrexham.

We've undertaken individual risk-assessments before reopening council-owned play areas and sports pitches.

People in Wales who are shielding will no longer need to after August 16.

The annual charge for the garden waste collection service in Wrexham will be introduced on August 31. Many tourism businesses have signed-up to the 'Good to Go' scheme, which recognises safety measures put in place to reassure visitors.

News that a cross-border response is underway to support the Airbus workforce has been welcomed. Businesses serving food to be eaten on-premises can now sign-up to the 'Eat Out to Help Out' initiative.

In case you missed it this briefing note is a summary of announcements, info and changes over the last couple of weeks.

#### This could be the most important job you ever do

The new North Wales Contact Tracing Service is recruiting people to join teams across the region in a range of roles. By now, you've hopefully heard about 'contact tracing' and how it's being used to help combat Covid-19 in Wales.

It involves tracing people who've come into contact with an infected person, and advising them on what to do (e.g. get tested, self-isolate).

It provides a useful summary of data, including the number of confirmed Covid-19 cases in each area.

#### Sports, play and leisure facilities

You might be wondering when council-owned play areas and sports pitches will reopen. For all the outdoor facilities above there's **currently no re-opening date** but we'll let you know when this changes and when they will be opening. The indoor and outdoor leisure facilities operated by

Freedom Leisure on behalf of Wrexham County Borough Council are also currently closed with **no official re-opening date**. We have open our children's play areas and outdoor gyms from 24 July with appropriate signage in place. We undertook risk-assessments for each facility and looked at what signage needed to be in place so we could reopen safely.

Shielding in Wales to pause from August 16

The Chief Medical Officer for Wales, Dr Frank Atherton, has confirmed people in Wales who are shielding will no longer need to after August 16. The change in advice means that from August 16, people in the shielding group will be able to go to work or school or go shopping, but they should continue to take steps to protect themselves.

https://gov.wales/shielding-wales-pause-16-august The weekly food box deliveries, which have been coordinated by local authorities, will also end after 16 August, but priority slots for online supermarket shopping will remain in place. As of 14 July, more than 152,000 food boxes have been delivered to shielding people across Wales. The prescription delivery service will continue until the end of September.

# Garden waste collection charges will apply from August 31

The annual charge for the garden waste collection service was originally due to be introduced back in April. It was suspended due to the coronavirus pandemic, but will now be introduced on Monday, August 31. As we were in lockdown it was decided that we would continue to empty all garden waste bins from April as the Household Recycling Centres had to close due to the restrictions about non-essential travel. The charge is the same as before – £25 per green garden waste bin per-year. Anyone who has not signed up by August 31 will no longer have their garden waste bin(s) emptied.

If you've already paid for the garden waste service, you don't need to do anything. If you already paid for the service earlier in the year you don't need to do anything you will receive a full 12 months service until August 31, 2021. Please continue to display the original sticker you were sent as new ones won't be sent out it doesn't matter that the contract date showing is now incorrect, your bin(s) will still get collected until August 31, 2021. https://news.wrexham.gov.uk/garden-waste-collection-charges-from-august-31/




our children back into school for their 'Check in, catch up and prepare' sessions.

#### SHIELDING TO END 16th AUGUST

Around 130,000 people in Wales have been taking shielding measures since the start of the pandemic because they are at high risk of developing serious illness if they contract coronavirus. This advice change means that, from 16 August, people in the shielding group can go to work and go shopping but they should continue to protect themselves from coronavirus by keeping a 2m distance from others and washing their hands frequently. The Chief Medical Officer has previously advised those shielding can take unlimited exercise outdoors and meet with members of one other household outdoors. People who are shielding can also form part of an extended household.

Dr Frank Atherton said: Shielding will have been difficult for many people – tens of thousands of people have made very significant personal sacrifices to follow the guidance and to protect their health during the pandemic. I want to thank them for that because it has not been easy. I also want to thank all who have supported those shielding. Shielding is a huge request for someone to undertake, so it's important that we don't ask people to shield for longer than is necessary. As the level of the virus in our communities is now low, shielding should pause from 16 August. This means those who have been shielding can gradually resume day-to-day life, but taking extra care around physical distancing and hand washing. We will keep this under review and if we see transmission levels increase, we may need to consider advising the shielding group to take extra precautions and measures to protect themselves in the future.

Over the summer, a review will be undertaken of all children on the shielding list. Although shielding is pausing, the list will be maintained. We will use the latest guidance from the Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health to determine whether each child needs to remain on the list. Dr David Tuthill, Wales Officer for the Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health, said: We now know more about coronavirus than we did a few months ago and have been able to update our guidance based on the evidence developed over those months. Serious illness from the virus in children is very rare and shielding itself brings its own problems for children. The lockdown has been tough for all children who have missed out on school, play and seeing friends – but especially for those who have been shielding. Should we face further outbreaks, we can be confident that the vast majority of children, including those under the sole care of a GP, will not need to shield. We hope this announcement will be good news for many families.

The weekly food box deliveries will end after **16**<sup>th</sup> **August**, but priority slots for online supermarket shopping will remain in place. As of mid July, more than 152,000 food boxes were delivered to shielding people across Wales. The prescription delivery service will continue until the end of September.



### PLAYING WITH JUNK THIS SUMMER

By now most children have played with and rediscovered every toy in their homes, some of them may still be providing entertainment, whereas others will be put back into toy boxes, with children looking for something new to play with.

In our playwork setting you will find very little, if any toys instead you will find junk items which we call loose parts. In the theory of loose parts, objects that don't have an obvious play function require the children to use their imaginations in order to play with them, the things children can do increases with the number of objects and the opportunity for the child to change and adapt them. Playworkers look for an objects play value rather than its financial



value when giving it to children. The advantage of loose parts is that they are cheap (mostly free), can be replaced once they no longer have play value and can be adapted to fit the child's play needs. The next time you go to throw something away

first ask yourself if the children can safely play with it? On playschemes unlikely things such as old

walking frames, suitcases and furniture have proved popular as well as the more obvious cardboard boxes and tubes.



### PKC GROUP UPDATE



A railway station at Cefn Mawr adjacent to Tesco remains a long-term goal of the PKC Group. Linking into the railway line will be a final key in setting up our community as a tourist destination and transport hub for the Dee Valley AONB, Pontcysyllte WHS and South Wrexham. We have estimated costs in the region of £8 to £12M. This may sound expensive and like a pipe dream however when considered in relation to other works this is a very reasonable price.

HS2 (what we call the Welsh Bypass) has recently been given the go ahead by the government and this will cost our community far more. From the last estimates not calculated by us, it will cost every man, woman and child in the UK £1,500 each. So, for the mere 10,000 of us in the villages surrounding the aqueduct, viaduct and Tesco this equals a combined bill of £15M, £3M more than a railway station for Cefn Mawr. How many of us will use HS2 if it ever gets built, as opposed to, how many of us would use a local railway station next to Tesco.

The next big bill will be from road transport. The A483 is a bottle neck between Mile End Roundabout at Oswestry and Ruabon as it is single lane each way and carries two main roads, the A483 and the A5 Traffic. The current road traffic count for this section of road is 10.5 million vehicles per year and is at capacity. To turn this seven-mile section of roadway including 2 viaducts into a dual carriage way will make £12M seem like a trifling sum.

Coming changes in technology. The price of fossil fuels is going to rise as reserves are depleted world-wide, and this is the big driver for the move from them to renewables, much more so than climate change. We have already heard that the government expects us to cash in our current cars and buy electric vehicles over the next 20 years, but there will be yet again another significant cost. Assuming we bought one new car per household as the government advocates and the cost of this new vehicle was very reasonable at a mere £10,000 each (currently nowhere near this),  $5000 \times 10,000 = £50M$ 

So again, a railway station at Cefn Mawr next to Tesco served by electric minibuses routed around our community to provide an efficient, effective and environmentally friendly public transport service is a very reasonable and cost-effective solution. Furthermore, a railway station next to Tesco would also serve a new Medical Centre at the old

Co-Op supermarket site which 2000 of us signed a petition for. This would work very well for our community and how many other Medical Centres in Wales are served by railway stations?

Any ways we are holding monthly meetings in the Holly Bush Inn on the second Tuesday of each month at 1900 and if you want to tell me I am nuts, please come along.
