How could the current situation with COVID -19 virus affect the funeral of my loved one?

Funerals in The Chapel at the crematorium are continuing as usual. If this changes we will let you know immediately. A maximum of 20 mourners will be able to attend a service in The Chapel at the Crematorium. Additional mourners will be able to listen to the service via the speakers outside the crematorium building but not standing in the foyer, standing in groups no closer than 2 meters (6') apart. Unfortunately you will be asked not to gather round, touch or kiss the coffin at the end of the service. If your loved one is to be buried this will be carried out with a short service at the graveside for close family and friends only. As churches are now opening and small congregations are allowed to gather as long as they are socially distanced a service or mass can be arranged.

How are we tailoring our service to meet the current government advice on social distancing?

Unfortunately we are currently not able to visit you in your home. We are asking you to come to our office to make arrangements and to sign any necessary paperwork. However we ask than no more than 2 people come at any one time. This is to ensure we can adhere to the advice to remain 2 meters (6') apart. If you are unable to come to our office we can easily discuss all necessary arrangements over the telephone. If there are forms that need to be signed we will deliver them to your home. We would be very grateful if you could sign the forms while we wait outside. To avoid transmission through physical contact we have taken the tough decision not to shake hands. Hand-washing facilities and hand sanitiser are available at all of our locations for you to use.







Issue 21 (5 Months since Lockdown) Wrexham Community support response to Recovery stage from Covid Briefing Sheet update 5 September

Opening of schools and colleges:

This week has seen a major move forward on our recovery journey into the new 'normal' with the return of our children and young people into schools and colleges. For many families this is a major milestone with some children starting for the first time and others transitioning from Primary into Secondary or secondary to College/6th Form. For many this will be the first time they have seen friends for nearly 6 months but will also bring heightened anxiety for parents and staff. Everyone in schools should be congratulated on the effort they have into creating safe teaching environments. Whatever stage someone is on their education and learning journey they will be faced with new rules and a changed physical layout of classrooms.

Parents have a major part in keeping children safe by following the rules set out by the schools around dropping off and picking up arrangements- the most crucial rule that remains in place is the two metre social distancing at the school gate. The use of face coverings on buses and in communal area of secondary schools is mandatory unless there are specific mitigating reasons that should be agreed with the schools

Holiday quarantine confusion:

This week there has been increased confusion for people who are going or returning from holidays with new additions applying to residents from Wales. The disjointed approach across the devolved nations is clearly going to lead to confusion about what is or is not permissible. The relevant Ministers are clearly basing decisions on what scientific and medical information they have but operating different schemes will/has led to even more uncertainty and anxiety. It needs to be noted that the changes in resect to specific countries will apply to Welsh residents irrespective if they have landed in a Welsh or English airport. It is the place of residency that determines if there is a need for 14-day isolation not the location of the airport.

Scale of Infection:

Thankfully there has been a significant drop in the number of cases that are having to be dealt with in hospital settings creating capacity to go back to more 'normal' hospital procedures. Hospital cases are still only one element and we should not forget the overall picture in some areas are still showing increases in the number of positive cases (particularly in South Wales) – many of these newer cases are in a lower age group where it appears the severity of Covid is not as great. This does not mean people should become complacent as there may only be 'mild' symptoms they need to remember that whilst positive they could pass the virus onto more vulnerable people who may be the next victim to need hospitalisation.

Dr Robin Howe, Incident Director for the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak response at Public Health Wales, said: "We are now seeing a steady increase in cases and our investigations show that, these have been transmitted due to a lack of social distancing, in particular by a minority of the 20-30 year age group. This has resulted in the spread of the virus to other groups of people. I repeat my direct appeal to young people to please remember that, even if they feel that they would not be badly affected by COVID-19 were they to test positive, should they pass it on to older or more vulnerable family members, friends or colleagues it could be extremely serious and even fatal". Daily Post 5th September

North Wales has now moved from the top of the county league table for infection in Wales due to the significant increase in various parts of South Wales. Most of these have been tracked back to a lack of social distancing at social gatherings. In North wales we had a case last weekend with several people testing positive because of sharing a minibus for a night out. It should be remembered that it only takes one infected person to meet one other for there to be a high risk of spreading to occur – being in a crowd statistically means more infection but the one to one is equally an issue.

Preventative action:

While there is still no Covid vaccine available the need for the defined group eligible for the Flu vaccine should take this up as soon as they become available. It is crucial this winter that the number of people who need hospital treatment for flu related symptoms is kept at the lowest level possible to ensure that the health services are not overwhelmed with Winter Pressures. It should also be noted that when/if a Covid vaccine becomes available there may be a need to have a clear 3 – 4-week gap between a fu vaccination taking place and a Covid one being administered. All the basic hygiene conditions remain crucial with hand washing in warm soapy water being required multiple times during the day. People need to keep themselves generally as fit and healthy as they can- exercise and diet being a major part of a person's overall wellbeing.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT:

Opening of Community Buildings- How to avoid having an Improvement Notice or fine being imposed. This is a lengthy section to reflect on the importance of ensuring communities are safe when attending events/ activities and to help organisers and participants make relevant preparations. There has been considerable confusion regarding the regulations on the opening of community buildings and what activities are permissible and which are not. There are very strong reasons why certain activities are not permitted based on trying to keep everyone safe. AVOW have been holding a series of meetings to bring together representatives of management groups to find out about the latest legislation and share examples of best practice. The next meeting will be on Wednesday 9th September at 11.00am when we will have Chris Buchan the lead officer in Welsh Government who has been preparing the Guidance on opening buildings. 'Improvement Notice' the same as pubs/restaurants - depending on the severity of a breech they also run the risk of being fined. ALL buildings must have a written Risk Assessment and every organiser of an Activity MUST also have their own Risk Assessment.



Under the scheme, employers can offer those aged 16-24 who are claiming Universal Credit a six-month work placement. The UK Government will fully fund each "Kickstart" job - paying 100% of the age-relevant National Minimum Wage, National Insurance and pension contributions for 25 hours a week. Employers will be able to top up this wage, while the UK Government will also pay employers £1500 to set up support and training for people on a Kickstart placement, as well as helping pay for uniforms and other set up costs. The jobs will give young people who are more likely to have been furloughed, with many working in sectors disproportionately hit by the pandemic the opportunity to build their skills in the workplace and gain experience to improve their chances of finding long-term work. We are currently experiencing some incidents of Bogus Callers/Scam phone calls/Scam visits in Flintshire and Wrexham.

This is to warn you about the incidents, to make you more vigilant and to pass information to those you know who are elderly or vulnerable and who won't be aware of the incidents through social media.

WCBC BIN STICKERS SHOULD ARRIVE WITHIN 10 WORKING DAYS AFTER YOU PAY FOR THE GARDEN WASTE SERVICE



With garden waste collection charges applied from Monday, August 31, a number of you who've recently signed up to the service have been asking us why you haven't received your bin sticker yet.

We want to remind residents that it can take up to ten working days after you pay for

the service before you will receive your sticker through the post. Cllr David A Bithell, Lead Member for Environment and Transport, said: "When your sticker arrives, please attach it to the lid of your garden waste bin(s). It's important you do this so that our crews will know that you've paid for the service. If it's been over ten working days since you paid for the service and you still haven't received your sticker from us, please let us know by calling the contact centre on **01978 298989**." If you signed up for the service earlier in the year, please continue to display the original sticker you were sent as new ones won't be sent out...it doesn't matter if the contract date showing is now incorrect, your bin(s) will still get collected until August 31,

You can sign up by calling the contact centre on **01978 298989** and making a card payment. Or you can now pay online to have your green

garden waste bin emptied, just go the www.wrexham.gov.uk/gardenwaste I don't want to have a garden waste bin anymore

If this is the case we'll pick it up. You can your visit MyAccount at

https://myaccount.wrexham.gov.uk/ and either login or sign up to ask for it to be taken away. We'll collect it, but it won't be straight away so please be patient. If in the future you change your mind and wish to pay to have a green bin emptied you will have to buy a new bin if you've already sent yours back.

I don't want to pay but want to keep my garden waste bin

That's fine. You can keep hold of it for the future but we won't empty it. If you do decide to pay for your green bin to be emptied in the future you also won't have to pay for a new green bin. We hope you will continue to have your garden waste bin emptied by us as we want to see Wrexham's recycling rates continue to increase year on year, but times are really hard and we understand if you don't wish to pay for this service.





PKC GROUP UPDATE



The Holly Bush Inn & Beer Garden, and the PKC Group move on. We are now seeking to work with the WAG, Welsh Assembly Government on their Circular Economy proposals for Wales which support the FGA, Future Generations Act 2015. This in our case will come at three levels, (1) Our Village Centre and the streets surrounding the Holly Bush Inn, (2) The Pontcysyllte WHS and the ex-Monsanto Site and (3) Nationally across Wales and the UK. We will explain these three levels over the next three articles so please keep reading the page.

At a local level (1), Cefn Mawr Village Centre we are taking a pride in our community and keeping the road junction of Oxford Street, Hill Street, Crane Street, Well Street and High Street where the Holly Bush Inn stands clean. We hope you have noticed. This is our Environmental Policy. During the COVID 19 Lockdown when we had to close because of Government Regulation we learnt many things to help our community. All our local pubs are shinning examples of a Circular Economy where we sell beer and other drinks in glasses which are washed and reused. The beer is delivered in kegs which are reused by our brewers to supply us with fresh beer for you. There is little waste in this and therefore is a good example of a circular economy which is the point we will be making with the WAG. Over 90% of our sales are made this way. For the limited amount of bottled and caned drinks we sell, we have a strict recycling policy where we achieve approximately 110%. This is possible because we also recycle all litter left on our streets around the Holly Bush Inn sold elsewhere (something we have learnt).

We hope to see you all for a beer some time at our pub, the Holly Bush Inn at the centre of our community and if you would like to talk about this I would be happy to explain further about it all.
