

World Book Day

Dear Parent/Guardian,

This year, World Book Day will be celebrated on the 4th March, 2021. World Book Day is a charity-organised event on a mission to help change children's lives by making reading for pleasure a habit for life.

As you will be aware, reading is a vital skill that is incredibly beneficial for your child. Evidence suggests that children who read every day perform well in reading tests, develop a broad vocabulary, increase their general knowledge and have a better understanding of other cultures. Fifteen minutes a day is the magic number at which secondary children start seeing substantial positive gains in reading achievement; however, children who read just over half an hour to an hour per day see the greatest gains of all.

World Book Day this year, just like everything else, will be different. Instead of receiving a printed £1 voucher in school, your child will receive a digital £1 voucher. This £1 book token can then be swapped for one exclusive, new and completely free World Book Day book (available from participating booksellers). Alternatively, it can be used to get £1 off any full price book or audiobook instead (as long as the book or audiobook costs at least £2.99). The World Book Day £1 books are a gift from booksellers, who fully fund the cost of the £1 book token redemptions.
