AN YSGOL RHIWABON ALUMNI HAS TAKEN THE REINS OF THE FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION OF WALES.



Steve Williams was formally voted in as the new president of the FAW last month and has now given some insight to his approach to the job as his four year term started on 1st August

Brought up in Cefn Mawr, Williams, 57, played an instrumental role in Cefn Albion's merger with Druids United to form current JD Cymru Premier club Cefn Druids in 1992. His early introduction into Welsh football politics and administration served him well, and his talent was identified early on by former FAW Councillor Jack Evans who helped him develop his own pathway that would see him elected onto the FAW Council in 1997 at the age of just 33. His subsequent work as secretary of the Cymru Alliance ensured that clubs in the area successfully achieved targeted projects, with his dedication to the domestic game earning him well-deserved respect across Wales.

"I don't want to be a President who is just sat here waiting for the phone to ring," Williams told the [FAW website](#), "I want to be involved and engaged in it. I think it's imperative that myself and Noel (new CEO, Noel Mooney) work with each other and sing off the same hymn sheet, and I can be eyes and ears in the north.

I know I'm going to be different than previous Presidents and I will be very hands on and open with our senior members of staff. I think

that's a key thing in a working relationship, and we must develop an openness within the association."

"The more that we can achieve at senior level the more that we can invest at a lower level, but we need those volunteers at our clubs. We want to keep on pushing the U17 and U19's, both male and female, and on top of that our own domestic game. I want to see the JD Cymru Premier move forward and I want to see the teams get stronger and make progress in Europe. For me, it's about being engaged and supportive, and trying to keep everyone on their toes to take us to the next level in everything that we're doing."

Williams worked closely with the late Gary Speed during his time as chair of the international committee, and was instrumental in the development and construction of Colliers Park. However, the future is very much the focus for Williams now as he begins his new role, with the return to competitive action for the men's and women's teams in September the immediate challenge.

"The World Cup in 2022 is the next tournament for us," he added.

"We all want to get there as I want to see us qualifying regularly for major tournaments. We need to make sure now that we're involved in these finals, because that will keep increasing our profile and our bank-balance for us to reinvest in our infrastructure.

WALES ENTERED ALERT LEVEL ZERO FROM 6AM SATURDAY - 7 AUGUST 2021

August 6, 2021



"As we approach the weekend there's some really good news as we complete the move to Alert Level Zero effective from 6am on Sunday morning (07.08.21). This means:

- The removal of legal restrictions on the number of people who can meet indoors, including in private homes, public places or at events
- All businesses and premises can open, including nightclubs
- People should still work from home wherever possible
- Face coverings will remain a legal requirement indoors, with the exception of hospitality premises. This will be kept under review.
- Fully vaccinated adults, under 18's and vaccine trial participants will not need to self-isolate if they are a close contact of someone with coronavirus.
- Some important restrictions remain in place and we all need to remember that although the number of positive cases, hospitalisation and deaths appears to be falling or levelling out Covid-19 is present in every community here in Wrexham and we still need to be cautious.
- There will be flexibility around social distancing and businesses and organisations must continue to have in place appropriate Risk Assessments.

- Face masks remain a requirement if you are using public transport:- taxis, buses or trains, so don't forget to take one with you whenever you are out and about.

Libraries and Community Resource Centres

For now the current Covid-19 measures will stay in place at all our libraries and community resource centres to allow staff to take a look at the new guidance and to see how they can be unlocked safely for customer and community use.

Vaccines

Thanks to everyone who has come forward and accepted the vaccination, we've made huge progress in Wrexham and the number of people receiving their first and second doses continues to rise along with numbers across North Wales.

It comes after 2020/2021 saw the largest number of flu vaccinations - over a million - ever given in Wales, and for the first time, the uptake in the over-65s exceeded 75%.

The COVID Booster Programme will also be co-administered to those who are eligible where appropriate to do so, in an effort to improve efficiency and increase uptake of both vaccines.

It comes amid warnings from the Chief Medical Officer in his annual flu letter that there could be a co-circulation of flu and COVID-19 this winter, as well as other respiratory infections.

Increasing the number of those eligible for the flu jab and coinciding this with the COVID booster programme will protect both the public and the NHS.

It is hoped extending the flu vaccination programme will also reduce morbidity and mortality associated with influenza, as well as reduce hospitalisations during a time when the NHS and social care may again be managing winter outbreaks of COVID-19.

As well as all those ages over 50, the schools programme will be extended to all those in secondary school in years 7-11.

It means the flu vaccination vaccine will be available on the NHS to well over 1.5m people in Wales this winter.

The Welsh Government has set an ambition of 75% of secondary school pupils to have the flu vaccination and 80% of those aged 65

and over.

An additional funding package of £6.8m will be allocated to health boards to reach both new cohorts.

The Chief Medical Officer for Wales, Frank Atherton, will be writing to NHS Wales about the National Influenza Immunisation Programme 2021-22, detailing the priority vaccination groups, the uptake ambitions, details of the vaccines available and the potential for co-administration of the COVID and flu vaccines this coming season. He said: "This is the first time we have extended the flu vaccination programme to those in school years 7-11, as we appreciate the greater risk of flu and respiratory conditions spreading through young people during the winter period.

We are concerned about a perfect storm of both flu and COVID-19 this winter, and are doing everything to prepare as best as we can."

Health Minister Eluned Morgan said: "It is very important people take the opportunity to have their flu vaccination and we are delighted it can be rolled out with the COVID booster in some situations."

It is thanks to the incredible success of our COVID vaccination programme, where we have learnt valuable lessons and seen unprecedented levels of uptake, that we have been able to extend the flu vaccination programme to all those over 50 years old and between years 7 to 11 in the schools programme.

We expect there to be a co-circulation of both flu and COVID-19 this winter and cannot stress enough how key it is that those who are eligible take up both their flu jab and COVID booster vaccine.

A new Public Health Wales guide has been devised to help communicators and people working with social media to know how to deal with misinformation about the virus.

Organisations focused on preventing transmission and mitigating harms of Coronavirus in Wales recognise the potential of false information to influence public behaviour and undermine the impact of their efforts. There have been increasing calls for guidance to help more effectively tackle false information particularly online.

Developed by National Health Protection Response Cell at Public Health Wales, '[Guidance for Countering False Information about Coronavirus or the Behaviours which Prevent its Transmission](#)' sets out, easy to use, effective actions that can be taken by public sector communications teams to minimise the impact of false information about Coronavirus.

The guide will enable communications teams to respond appropriately to misinformation on social media, with clear actions on how best to deal with misinformation on line and how to debunk myths about Coronavirus.

NHS Network ensures vulnerable safeguarded despite unprecedented challenge of pandemic

According to a new report, published by Public Health Wales, The NHS Wales Safeguarding Network effectively managed to continue its vital work to protect vulnerable groups despite the significant increase in demand and extreme challenges caused by the Coronavirus pandemic.

The National Safeguarding Team works closely with Welsh Government, NHS Health Boards and Trusts to continually improve safeguarding of vulnerable groups such as children, young people and vulnerable adults across NHS Wales and other partnership agencies by linking up people, learning and resources.

The report expands on the highly complex, challenging deliverables achieved in 2020-21 through collaboration across the Network and the implementation of innovative new ways of working that was vital to enable the continued safeguarding of these groups and vastly reduce any negative effects that the lockdowns could have on them.

Lasting Powers of Attorney -Opportunities to contribute-

Many of you are working with vulnerable people, families and carers for whom the current lasting powers of attorney (LPA) arrangements are vitally important. They can also be deeply problematic and, too often, beyond reach.

You may be aware that the Ministry of Justice and the Office of the Public Guardian (OPG) have had a project underway to modernise the LPA system. There are now opportunities for you to find out more and to ensure your clients' experiences and

needs are considered in the proposals for change.

1. Full details of the [project to modernise lasting powers of attorney](#) are available online. It aims to:

- increase safeguards, especially for the donor;
- improve the process of making and registering an LPA for donors, attorneys and third parties; achieve sustainability for the OPG whilst keeping LPAs as affordable as possible for all people in society.

2. Written contributions are now invited to the [official consultation](#) which includes potential changes to the legislation. (Deadline 13 October 2021.)

# HAVE YOUR SAY ON HOW NORTH WALES IS POLICED

July 29, 2021



People across North Wales are being urged to help draw up a new blueprint for the way the region is policed and help decide where 20 extra PCSOs should work.

North Wales Police and Crime Commissioner Andy Dunbobbin

and Chief Constable Carl Foulkes are asking local communities, groups and representative bodies to tell them what they think is most important and what they are most worried about.

Mr Dunbobbin is preparing to write his first Police and Crime Plan after being elected in May and is keen for as many people as possible to have a voice in the process.

Along with the Chief Constable, he is asking people to take part in a survey which will help shape North Wales Police's priorities.

The survey covers all aspects of policing, from tackling serious and organised crime and protecting children and young people from sexual exploitation and abuse, to dealing with social media trolling and responding to non-emergency calls.

The survey is now available at <https://www.surveymonkey.co.uk/r/SMDKY8R> **for people to complete until Friday, 20<sup>th</sup> August.**

Paper copies will be available for those who do not wish to fill in the online version. There will also be an easy read version available.

It's in the form of multiple choice questions with participants indicating on a scale of one to five how important they consider each different aspect of policing to be.

The aim is to publish the plan in September.

Mr Dunbobbin said: "North Wales is one of safest places to live, work and visit in the UK and I want to ensure we keep it that way.

As the North Wales Police and Crime Commissioner, I have statutory duty to consult local people on policing priorities.

"In consultation with the force, I'm drafting my first Police and Crime Plan and in order to do that the force and I need to be aware what local people believe the policing priorities should be.

"My aim is to ensure that the views, needs and expectations of all parts of our communities are reflected in the plan.

"I am accountable to the people when it comes to crime and anti-social behaviour so it is vitally important for me to find out what people think about how the region should be policed.

"The updated Police and Crime Plan will set out in plain English and Welsh the level of service people can expect to receive from their local police force.

"Essentially, I will be consulting the public on the policies contained in my manifesto when I was elected.

"The Welsh Government is funding an increase in the number of PCSOs in Wales from 500 to 600. I have had conversations to make sure that North Wales gets its fair share and as a result the force is to have an additional 20 of them.

"The survey also provides people with the opportunity to give their view on where they think the PCSOs should work.

"Importantly, the rights and interests of victims will be at the heart of the Police and Crime Plan.

"The North Wales Victim Help Centre does excellent work and it has specialist teams have been set up to provide support for victims of cybercrime, child sexual exploitation, modern day slavery and fraud.

"I am keen to invest further in victim services and I will be setting up a victims' panel so that survivors also have a voice in the way we operate and the support we provide so that we can do things better.

"The purpose of the Police and Crime Plan is to ensure the force is paying specific attention to those points which have been identified as crucial by the public, me and indeed by the force itself.

"An important part of my role as Commissioner will be to monitor the force's compliance with the plan and I will be rigorous in holding them to account on behalf of the people of North Wales.

"Chief Constable Foulkes said: "The views of the people of North Wales are really important to us and through previous surveys have shaped the force we are today.

"We want to make sure we are addressing the concerns of local communities to influence the content and priorities of the Police and Crime Plan, and crucially how North Wales is policed. Our aim is to ensure that all our diverse local communities have a say in shaping future services and the allocation of resources.

"Completing the survey won't take up too much time but it will make a big difference in terms of our understanding of what is important to the public, what they think we do well and where they think we could improve. The Commissioner and I look forward to hearing from as many people as possible."
