Ken Skates MS Welcomes New Welsh Government Support Package for Unpaid Carers

Member of the Senedd for Clwyd South, Ken Skates, has welcomed a new £7m package of support for unpaid carers in recognition of the vital support they provide to the people they care for.

The new support package includes:

- £5.5m for local authorities to provide targeted support to unpaid carers
- £1.25m for the Carers Support Fund. Last year, this fund successfully helped almost 6500 unpaid carers to cope with the financial impact of Covid-19
- £20,000 to fund online mental wellbeing support sessions
- £230,000 for the Family Fund to support over 600 further low-income families with seriously ill or disabled children.

The Welsh Government previously committed £3m in 2021-22 to allow more carers to take a break from their caring role, bringing the total additional funding support for unpaid carers this year to £10m.

Welcoming the fund, Ken Skates MS said: "The funding announced today shows how much the Welsh Labour Government appreciates and values the army of unpaid carers in Wales who have gone above and beyond to care for family or friends.

"The physical and emotional impact of caring can be overwhelming - it's vital that we continue to help and support our unpaid carers with the emotional and financial impact of Covid-19."

Funding Initiatives:

£45 million package to train staff and help Welsh SMEs grow (a Wrexham Business Grant scheme is to be made available)

Welsh Government Economy Minister, Vaughan Gething, [announced on 23rd November](#) that a £45 million package of funding is being made available, which will help small businesses across Wales to grow, and support thousands of people to train to work in key sectors.

Of the £45 million package, £35 million will be made available via local authorities across Wales to assist small and medium sized businesses (SMEs) relaunch, develop, decarbonise and grow to help drive Wales' economic recovery.

Wrexham County Borough Council are currently developing a 'Wrexham Business Grant' scheme which will aim to assist, via discretionary financial support, the growth and expansion prospects of financially viable enterprises. Qualifying pre-start, together with existing small and medium sized enterprises (SMEs) that are eligible and based within Wrexham County Borough, will be able to apply. A SME is defined by the European Commission as an enterprise employing up to 250 people, with either a turnover at less than €50 million or a balance sheet at less than €43 million.

As a brief summary of the Wrexham Business Grant:

- The scheme will offer funding of up to 50% on eligible expenditure for projects.
- Grants must be valued between £3,000 and £50,000.
- Where an application is approved the business must fund 100% of project expenditure before receiving the agreed grant as a reimbursement.
- Projects must be completed by 31st March 2022.
- The grant value awarded will be linked to anticipated outputs / benefits of the proposed project. i.e. job creation, carbon reduction etc.

Further updates will be provided over the next week on when the grant scheme will launch, how to apply along with detailed eligibility criteria.

£10 million package to train staff

The remaining £10 million of the £45 million package will be made available to further education colleges for a further expansion of Personal Learning Accounts. This will allow colleges to deliver additional courses and qualifications to support 2,000 people to access a wider range of job opportunities, and increase their earning potential in priority sectors.

These include:

- Logistics (in particular HGV and LGV driving) including driver licence fees and tests. Funding will be targeted at driver training by offering courses to new potential drivers, provide refresher training for those who may be seeking a return to the sector, and to train and increase the number of instructors and examiners available to conduct driving tests
- Green construction and renewable energy - including roles in housing retrofit, and in wind, tidal and solar power sectors
- Advanced materials and manufacturing - including technical engineers
- Hospitality - including chefs, catering assistants, waiting and front of house staff
- Health and social care - including support to re-engage and retrain former health and social care employees back into the sector and meet the new licence to practice requirements.

Building a confident future for electric car users

Ambitious plans that set out how the Welsh Government will be investing in infrastructure and working with the private sector to give people in Wales the confidence to make the switch to electric vehicles have been unveiled.

With already more than 1,000 public charging points across Wales, one for every six battery electric vehicles, the plans, which can be found via the link below, set out an approach to ensure that the number of charging points continue to grow to meet increasing demand as fossil fuel vehicles are phased out.

The EV Charging Action Plan also sets out how the Welsh Government will be working closely with the private sector, with the aim of delivering a charging point facility for every 20 miles of the strategic trunk network across Wales by 2025, providing further reassurance to electric vehicle drivers:

The Welsh Government's Ultra Low Emissions Vehicle (ULEV) Transformation Fund has already provided a kick-start for many EV projects across Wales and the next round of ULEV funding will open for bids in December 2021. The fund will help local authorities deliver more than 300 publicly accessible fast and rapid charging points across Wales this financial year. There are also plans in place to increase both public and private sector delivery in line with the Welsh Government's strategy in future years.

Postponed VAT Accounting

The benefits and where can you find out more

From 1 January 2022 you can continue to use Postponed VAT Accounting (PVA) on all customs declarations that require you to account for import VAT, including supplementary declarations, except when HMRC have told you otherwise.

PVA has already provided significant cash flow benefits for thousands of HMRC customers, and they expect that most businesses will choose to use it. This is because PVA allows UK VAT-registered importers to account for and recover import VAT on their VAT return, rather than paying the import VAT when the goods are imported. You can use PVA for goods you're importing from the EU or other countries. And PVA is not a temporary process, so you will be able to continue to use it following the end of staged customs controls.

There isn't an application process, but you do need to confirm in your customs declaration that you are using PVA, and you'll need to make sure that the person making your VAT declarations is also prepared

If you use the Customs Handling of Import and Export Freight (CHIEF) system

On your declaration, enter:

- Your EORI number starting with 'GB' which includes your VAT registration number into box 8 (Header Consignee), or, if applicable, your VAT registration number in box 44h (Registered Consignee)
- 'G' (Postponed accounting for VAT approved) as the method of payment in Box 47e.

If you use the Customs Declaration Service (CDS)

On your declaration, enter:

- Your VAT registration number at header level in data element 3/40

Please note that VAT will be recorded against your EORI and will be at declaration level only

If you use someone else to do your declarations for you, it's your responsibility to tell them if you want to use PVA

If someone else is doing your customs declarations for you such as a freight forwarder, customs agent, broker or fast parcel operator you need to tell them that you want to use PVA to account for import VAT on the imported goods. They can then complete the customs declaration correctly on your behalf, and you should keep a written record of what is agreed.

Extended Loss Carry Back for Businesses

The Government introduced legislation in the Finance Act 2021 that provides a temporary extension to the loss carry back rules for trading losses of both corporate and unincorporated businesses. Excise Goods Warehousing Guidance

HMRC have recently published new guidance to explain the UK's requirements for the warehousing of excise goods held in duty-suspension within the UK by an authorised warehousekeeper, registered owner, duty representative or registered consignor in the UK. You should read the guidance, which can be found via the link below, if you:

Welsh Government's Young Person's Guarantee Officially Launched

Economy Minister Vaughan Gething officially launched the Welsh Government's Young Person's Guarantee on 15th November, which will provide everyone under 25 with the offer of work, education, training, or self-employment, with Working Wales being the single gateway via which 16 to 24 year old in Wales will be able to access the Guarantee. Working Wales is also trialling a new Job Matching service, to assist young people with securing employment and to help employers fill vacancies.

Phase one of the Guarantee provides young people aged 16 to 24 in Wales with access to:

- One simple route to access the guarantee via Working Wales - support and advice from advisers will be provided in multiple forms, including virtually, on the high street, and through improved outreach facilities across Wales
- Self-employment advice and support available through Big Ideas Wales
- Traineeships, that provide work experience and training
- Training and wage incentives via the ReAct programme
- A place on one of the Welsh Government's outreach Community Employability programmes
- Help to find an apprenticeship
- A new course search platform, for those wanting to enter further education or higher education, to make it easier to find their choice
- A referral to one of the programmes funded by other partners, such as DWP and Local Authorities

New plans to boost cyber security of UK's digital supply chains IT service providers could be required to follow new cyber security rules such as the [National Cyber Security Centre's Cyber Assessment Framework](#) as part of new proposals to help British businesses manage the growing cyber threat.

Other plans to protect the country's digital supply chains include new procurement rules to ensure the public sector buys services from firms with good cyber security and plans for improved advice and guidance campaigns to help businesses manage security risks. The government are in the process of developing more detailed policy proposals and are carrying out a review of the laws and measures, which encourage firms to improve their cyber security. A new national cyber strategy will be launched later this year.

[Wrexham Maelor Hospital has opened the first ward of its kind in North Wales which helps prepare patients to leave hospital and go home.](#)

The ward, called Ready for Home Ward, has capacity for five

patients who no longer need medical attention, but need to be observed and assessed by therapists and nurses from the Home First Team to see how they will cope once they are home, and decide what further support they may need.

The ward has been made to look less clinical and more like a 'home' and the patients are encouraged to wear their own day clothes, prepare their own meals in a 'home' style kitchen and to eat together.

Therapists will work with patients to ensure that they achieve optimum independence during their stay.


