Winter is coming – get your boosters

Member of the Senedd Ken Skates has urged people in his Clwyd South constituency to take up their offers of COVID-19 booster jabs as soon as possible.

Ahead of the winter months, Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board (BCUHB) is working its way through its list of priority patients – with 34% of people in Mr Skates' constituency already boosted.

Mr Skates raised the issue in the Senedd yesterday (Wednesday) following concerns locally that some surgeries are behind others in offering boosters, particularly for children.

Health Minister Eluned Morgan told MSs: "As of October 11, a total of 363,000 COVID-19 vaccination boosters have been administered in Wales. The programme is on track for all eligible people to receive an invitation for their booster by November 30, in line with the commitment given in our winter respiratory vaccination strategy which was published on July 15."

Mr Skates said: "Thank you, Minister. That's excellent news. The vaccine, of course, is the most effective way to defend ourselves against COVID. In order to live with the virus, it's incumbent on us all to accept the jab when it's available to us. It's also vital that the roll-out of the programme continues in the most efficient and equitable way.

"Are you confident that people are able to have the vaccine in a consistent time frame across all communities and for each age group in Wales?"

The Health Minister responded: "Well, we are talking about trying to get this booster to 1.6 million eligible people in Wales. That's being delivered through 400 vaccination sites, so I think that does give you the coverage that should allow people to take up that opportunity.

"Our target is to get to a 75% uptake of that cohort, and so far we're on track. I'm slightly concerned that we're not getting the response from health and care workers that I had hoped we'd get, so I would encourage those workers in particular to take up that opportunity, in addition, of course, to vulnerable people, and to come forward if it's offered."

She added: "I know that in Clwyd South, 34% of the people eligible have already had their vaccinations."

BCUHB is continuing to offer boosters in priority order in line with JCVI (Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation) advice, by age and clinical vulnerability.

A health board spokesperson said: "All autumn booster appointments will be arranged by invitation, so there is no need to contact us. Anyone who has received an invitation and has any concerns, queries or needs to change the date or time can do so via our COVID-19 Vaccination Contact Centre on 03000 840004. Telephone lines are open 8am-7pm Monday to Friday and 9am-2pm on weekends." **-Ends**



Wrexham Council sets up "cost of living crisis" working group

Wrexham Council has created a new 'Cost of Living Crisis' working group in a bid to support residents with through what is expected to be a difficult winter.

Executive board members last week supported the creation of the joint member/office working group – which is made up of 10 elected members and is politically balanced.

The group, which aims to help residents with the significant rise in everyday costs, will be meeting within two weeks.

The creation of a cost of working group to look at and support local residents in the key areas of:

- Benefit maximisation
- Reducing costs on energy
- Fuel poverty
- Winter pressures

Leader of the Council Mark Pritchard and Lead Member for Finance said: These are very challenging times and I am pleased that we have set up this group.

"We will be making representations to UK and Welsh Government to lobby for financial support as part of the cost of living crisis and budget preparations for next year."

David A Bithell Deputy Leader and Lead Member for housing said:

"Not only are we facing a housing crisis we are facing significant challenges with the rise in energy costs.

We have been meeting with Welsh Government every two weeks which has just started and now is the time to set up a group with all members of the council via their respective groups to work together to try and support our constituents.

"We are proactively working with Welsh Government to support and influence additional monies to local authorities during the winter period.

Last week Wrexham Council announced that **over the winter months all of** its <u>libraries will be available as a warm space</u> for people during the day.

Samaritans will be at Queens Square, Wrexham from 10am to 3pm to talk to locals about their services and provide emotional support to anyone who may need it. They will also be joined by representatives from Wrexham Council – Well-being and Housing Support teams, Wrexham and District Citizen's Advice Bureau, Transport for Wales, and the Unique Transgender Network.

Older People's Commissioner for Wales launches new guide on older people's rights in care homes

The Older People's Commissioner for Wales has launched a new guide for older people, which provides crucial information about their rights when moving into and living in a care home.

The Commissioner developed the guide to help older people and their families to better understand the rights they have, what they can do if they are concerned that their rights are not being upheld, and details of organisations that can provide help and support, including the Commissioner's own advice and assistance team.

The guide includes information about rights relating to living in a care home that older people and their families are often not aware of, such as the right older people have to be involved in decisions about their care, rights relating to contact with family members, and rights to access services such as health services. In addition, the guide also provides information on rights relating to paying for care, an issue that is often of great concern for older people and their families.




