UK Government's fiscal experiment 'doomed to failure from the outset'

People in North Wales will be hit hard by the UK Government 'steering the economy like a bumper car', Members of the Senedd were warned today.

Former Welsh Government Economy Minister Ken Skates attacked floundering Prime Minister Liz Truss and sacked Chancellor Kwasi Kwarteng's disastrous mini-budget, and accused the beleaguered Westminster Government of treating the people of Wales as 'experimental guinea pigs'.

The Senedd also heard that despite the raft of Tory U-turns announced this week by the latest Chancellor Jeremy Hunt, the damage has already been done.

During First Minister's Questions, Mark Drakeford told Clwyd South MS Mr Skates: "The recent turmoil in UK financial markets, for which the UK Government's fiscal statement was the catalyst, has increased the cost of borrowing for Government, business, and ordinary citizens. It will damage growth, worsen the public finances, and make life harder for borrowers, including homebuyers."

Mr Skates said: "Of course, the fourth Chancellor in as many months has now buried Trussonomics and U-turned on pretty much the entire mini-budget, but, as you outlined, the effects of steering the economy like a bumper car will have devastating consequences. Higher taxes, higher inflation, high mortgage rates. Is it fair that the people of Wales and the people of the UK are being treated like experimental guinea pigs by the Conservatives?"

The First Minister continued: "It's not fair that we have all been subjected to the failed experiment, a failed experiment that took less than a month to collapse in front of us.

"And the reason it's particularly unfair is that the experiment was doomed to failure from the outset. An economic approach, based on the failed theories of trickle-down economics, depending upon uncosted borrowing, was always going to fail. People across the UK will now pay the price. "I'll give just one example. Because of the increase in the mortgage rate that we now see as a result of what has happened, by 2024, people across the United Kingdom will have paid out £26bn in additional interest payments – £26bn taken out of the pockets of families right across the UK.

"It's not more than a couple of weeks ago that the Prime Minister was trying to portray those people who didn't agree with her failed ideas as anti-growth. That was never ever the case, of course, but what's now guaranteed is that the recession the Bank of England says we are already in will be deeper and longer than it otherwise would have been, because that £26bn would have been available for people to spend in shops, hospitality, to do the things that keeps the economy going.

"That £26bn by itself will now no longer be there to support the economy back into growth. Here in Wales, this time next year, the average person with a mortgage will be paying £2,300 more in a year than they would be had interest rates stayed where they were in the current quarter. That is the scale of the failed experiment, and that's only one example of it." -Ends-

Eurovision a 'prime opportunity' to promote Wales to the World

Ken Skates has urged the Welsh Government to use next year's Eurovision Song Contest to promote North Wales to the world.

The Clwyd South MS and former Economy Minister said the 2023 event in Liverpool 'is a wonderful opportunity' given its close proximity to the Welsh border.

During yesterday's Business Statement in the Senedd, Mr Skates raised the issue with Trefnydd and Minister for North Wales Lesley Griffiths.

He said: "I'm in no doubt that you'd agree that hosting Eurovision 2023 in Liverpool is fantastic news for the whole of Wales, but particularly for North Wales. I'd be very grateful for a statement on how the Welsh Government plans to promote North Wales and the whole of Wales at next year's event.

"It is a wonderful opportunity, given how closely we work with partners on a cross-border basis, and might I suggest that the Minister for North Wales attends to promote North Wales at Eurovision 2023, along with excellent officials from the economy, major events and tourism teams?"

Ms Griffiths replied: "I think you make a really important point. The links between North Wales, and particularly north-east Wales, and the north-west of England are very important, and we know that people do travel to Liverpool, Manchester, and further afield, to see arts and culture events.

"Clearly, the Eurovision contest coming to Liverpool is very important. I will certainly ask the Deputy Minister for economy, who has responsibility for culture and arts, to update Members. I don't think she's had the opportunity to have discussions yet, but I'm sure she will be doing."

Liverpool beat Glasgow to host Eurovision 2023, which is being held in the UK following its second-place finish behind Ukraine in this year's contest.

After yesterday's plenary session, Mr Skates added:

"I was really pleased when Eurovision was awarded to Liverpool. Obviously, it should be held in Ukraine, but I know Liverpool will do the event justice. We share close cross-border links with the major cities of north-west England, and next year's event is a prime opportunity to once again, proudly showcase North Wales to the world." -Ends-

Swimming pools need help to meet soaring energy and chemical costs

Plas Madoc Leisure Centre was praised in the Senedd this week when local MS Ken Skates highlighted the impact soaring energy costs are having on community swimming pools.

The Member for Clwyd South expressed his fears that pools like Plas Madoc, which is a not-for-profit social enterprise, could face financial ruin if they don't get more help.

Mr Skates also highlighted the huge increase in the cost of chemicals – and the delays in their delivery – which pools are facing as a consequence of the UK leaving the European Union.

Economy Minister Vaughan Gething said that the Welsh Government would look at working with the UK Government – which is responsible for regulating the energy industry – to find a resolution.

He told the Senedd: "Public swimming pools are an important health and leisure resource. We know that many face unprecedented challenges. We will continue to monitor the situation closely and, where necessary, work with the UK Government to do everything possible to ensure that they remain open in the face of significant rises in energy and running costs."

Mr Skates said: "Thank you, Minister. That's really reassuring to hear, and I know that you're familiar with the story of Plas Madoc Leisure Centre in my constituency and the incredible work done by volunteers to keep it open through thick and thin.

"But they're really facing the wall this winter, partly as a result of Brexit – with chemical costs rising through the roof, and delivery challenges – but also because of rising energy prices.

"Minister, what exactly do you think could be done by Welsh Government, and by UK Government, to support those vital public swimming pools that do so much good for public health?"

The Minister responded: "You're right, we have some really big challenges. It's one of the things that isn't often talked about, but the costs in chemical imports is a real issue in this and other sectors.

"We gave local government a generous settlement at the start of last year, with an announcement of a 9.4% increase in their budgets. Yet we've seen that overtaken by inflation, so local authorities aren't full of lots of money to help these enterprises continue and succeed. We know the damage that is done if they close, and I in particular pay tribute to all the people around Plas Madoc who have kept it running." Mr Gething said he was hopeful swimming pools like Plas Madoc would qualify for support through the UK Government's scheme for non-domestic energy users.

"I think swimming pools have a good case to be treated as an energy-intensive enterprise," he said. "We'll continue to make the case at UK level as well as trying to work constructively with our partners in local government, because I certainly want to see swimming pools continue for use for people of all ages." -Ends-

Wrexham-based bank has boosted Welsh economy by £1.2bn, says MS

The Wrexham-based Development Bank of Wales is doing an 'incredible' job in turbulent economic times, says Member of the Senedd Ken Skates.

The Clwyd South MS, who launched the first bank of its kind in the UK during his time as Economy Minister, said he was proud to see it going from strength to strength.

According to the most recent numbers from the Office for National Statistics, the Welsh economy is growing faster than the rest of the UK – which Mr Skates said makes a mockery of Liz Truss' recent claim Labour is 'anti-growth'.

He said: "The Welsh Government created the Development Bank to operate where there was market failure and to support economic opportunity by making finance available to viable businesses. It has done that in spades, with a total impact of £1.2bn in its first five years. That's £1.2bn created in Wales, for the Welsh economy, which simply wouldn't be there otherwise.

"The Development Bank has hit numbers which far exceed its initial ambitions. Particularly now, in such uncertain times, its role has never been more important. We are all in for an extremely rough ride because of the ineptitude and fiscal irresponsibility of this chaotic UK Government, but the bank is doing an incredible job and I'm proud to see it going from strength to strength." Since its launch, the Development Bank of Wales has become one of the most active venture capital investors in the UK. In 2021/22, it invested £109.1m – an increase of £3.6m on the previous year. The last financial year saw 519 investments in over 460 businesses all over Wales.

Mr Skates said: "We were particularly keen for the bank to be based in North Wales, and we chose Wrexham. North Wales is now seeing the benefits of that decision, with our region benefiting particularly well from the bank's investment's last year.

"The confidence being shown in our business by the Development Bank has driven record levels of co-investment, with private sector investors recognising the potential of Welsh companies."

The bank has also targeted property funds, which back small and medium-sized developers to build new homes, offices and mixed-use developments. Of the 223 properties built in Wales as a direct result of Development Bank investment, 50 were in Wrexham county borough.

The bank's chief executive, Giles Thorley, said the key priorities for the years ahead will remain a focus on decarbonisation and supporting firms' transitions to Net Zero. **-Ends-**

Do you and your teams/service know enough about Gambling and Affected Others?

Whether this is a new subject for you or whether you've attended our free CPD accredited sessions before, this Regional Event will focus the mind on Gambling Related Harms and affected others, providing you with two hours of new information and resources to tackle this silent addiction.

Did you know in the UK currently 0.5% of our population are considered problem gamblers and 7% of the population of the UK are negatively affected by gambling? This is over 4 million people in England and over 5 million people across the UK as a whole, which is one in 12 people either directly or indirectly affected by gambling-related harms: with numbers unfortunately ever on the increase.

Although gambling harms is often not 'a spoken about subject', people will present with debt, mental health issues, housing problems, isolation, and suicidality.

- Everyone visiting this year will need to BOOK IN ADVANCE.
- Tickets are FREE ONE TICKET REQUIRED PER VEHICLE (NOT PER PERSON).
- Proof of booking will be required on entry to the field.
- Tickets have been released for all dates up to and including Saturday 29th October. We will review pumpkin availability for the 30th and 31st October closer to the time.

Please arrive onsite within your half hour time slot. E.g. If you have a 10am – 10.30am booking you can arrive at any time during that half hour. There is no restriction on the amount of time you can spend in our fields.

10am to 5pm (Last entry to the Spooky Maize Maze is 4pm) From Monday 24th October we plan to open every day until Monday 31st October.

- Pumpkin prices start at £2.00 per pumpkin. You just pay for the pumpkins you pick.
- Cash and card payments accepted for pumpkins (cash is preferred as our card machines are temperamental down our fields).
- Spooky Maize Maze entry is £2.00 per person with under 3's free.
- Cash only for the Maize Maze.
- Free Parking (all weather surface).

- In the event that you miss your allocated time, we reserve the right to decline entry to the fields.

What are the ground conditions and what should I wear? We are a working farm so the ground can be uneven and muddy. Sensible footwear is re-quired and wellies and raincoats are advised. The pumpkin plants can be prickly so children should have their legs and arms covered.

Is it accessible for prams/wheelchairs?

Visitors with very sturdy prams/wheelchairs have accessed our fields in previous years. However, we can't promise that it will be possible as it depends on the conditions underfoot on the day.

Are their toilet facilities available?

Toilets will be located near the field but unfortunately baby change facilities are only available in the Garden Centre.

Will the pumpkins last until Halloween if bought early?

If you look after your pumpkin it will last for weeks UNCARVED. Store them somewhere frost free with plenty of fresh air e.g. a shed, garage or outside. Once carved your pumpkin will last 3-5 days outside.

Are dogs allowed?

Sorry no dogs are allowed on the pumpkin fields. Well behaved dogs on leads are allowed on the car park field.

Do you provide wheelbarrows?

Wheelbarrows will be available for your use on a first come first serve basis. We suggest you bring a large bag for life just in case all of our wheelbarrows are being used.

Will food and drink be available?

You can visit our <u>Strawberry Fields Restaurant</u> in the main Garden Centre which is on the same site. We will also have a catering trailer down in our pumpkin fields on weekends serving hot and cold snacks and drinks.
