New Emergency Alerts system has been tested nationally on 23rd April 2023



The UK government's new Emergency Alerts system is now live. The system will enable people to be contacted via their mobile phone when lives are in danger.

It will be used to warn you in the event of emergencies, such as severe flooding.

Emergency Alerts are sent to all compatible mobile phones within an area of risk. They don't track your location, need your phone number, or collect personal data.

Only the government and the emergency services will be able to send them. If you don't have a mobile phone, you'll still be kept informed through other channels.

If you get an Emergency Alert on your phone, you'll hear a loud, sirenlike sound. A message on your screen will tell you about the emergency and how best to respond. You'll be able to check an alert is genuine at **gov.uk/alerts**.

If you receive an alert, read the alert carefully and follow the instructions. You can opt out of receiving emergency alerts; for more information on how to opt out please go to **gov.uk/alerts**

The NEW NHS Wales App

The new NHS Wales App will be at the heart of enabling people to engage digitally with NHS and social care service across Wales. The app has successfully undergone private beta testing, involving 700 people from 10 GP practices across Wales, and it will now start public beta testing.

As we move to public beta testing, a version of the NHS Wales App will be published on Apple and Google app stores for download. It will also be available at NHS Wales App website (English) and App GIG Cymru (Cymraeg). This is not the final version of the app – the Digital Services for Patients and the Public (DSPP) team, which is developing the app, will be releasing functionality as it is developed. There will also be a way for users to provide feedback to help the team to continue improving the app.

Over a quarter of households with babies and pre-school children are food insecure

New data from <u>The Food Foundation</u> has found families with younger children are at particularly high risk of food insecurity: a worrying 27.3% of households with a child under the age of 4 experienced food insecurity in January 2023.

This is significantly higher than households without children where 15.4% were food insecure, and higher than households with only school-aged children (23.0%).

Wales is set to be the first in the UK to increase Education Maintenance Allowance payment

From April 2023, the Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) will increase from £30 per week to £40 for eligible further education students in sixth form or college. EMA is a weekly grant designed to support 16 to 18-year-olds from low-income households with further education costs, such as transport or meals. The increase will be a commitment for the next two academic years, while a comprehensive review into EMA is conducted. Around 16,000 FE students in Wales currently receive the payment, which is paid every two weeks.

FE students are eligible for EMA if their household income is £20,817 or less, if they are the only young person in the household, or £23,077 if there is more than one

young person in the household. An <u>FE Calculator</u> (Student Finance Wales) is available to check students eligibility.

Wrexham AFC have finally secured their place back in the Football League after 15 agonising years in the non-league wilderness. Phil Parkinson and his men were forced to battle almost until the very end to clinch the National League title, mainly due to the relentless challenge of Notts County at the summit.



The achievement was also due in no small part to the investment of the club's Hollywood co-chairmen Ryan Reynolds and Rob McElhenney, who have immersed themselves in the vibrant culture of

the <u>Wrexham</u> community. The team was also backed in huge numbers throughout the campaign by an army of supporters both in Wales and from across the globe.

As fans pour onto the pitch after the 3-1 win over Boreham Wood on Saturday night, the owners tearfully come to terms with what has happened, before later heading down to the pitch to congratulate players and staff and take in the moment.

It was a moment thousands of Wrexham fans will never forget – when the club finally clinched promotion back to the Football League.

For <u>Wrexham</u> co-owners Ryan Reynolds and Rob McElhenney it is the Hollywood ending they had dreamed of and the emotion was clear to see.

Filmed by fellow Hollywood actor Paul Rudd, who was a few feet from the pair as they watched on, the footage offers a glimpse into just how much going up means to the pair who have affectionately become known as plain Rob and Ryan in Wrexham. Reynolds said of the footage on social media: "Rob and I kinda blacked out during this moment, but somehow we'll never forget it."
