Online cowards show: 'hatred still hides in all parts of Wales', says MS

Clwyd South MS Ken Skates has called out 'cowards' who 'spread their poison' online.

During a Senedd discussion for "National Hate Crime Awareness Week", Mr Skates said 'hatred still hides in all parts of Wales' and highlighted recent abuse aimed at S4C presenter Ameer Davies-Rana. He also called for social media companies to be more responsible and proactive in stopping the spread of hatred on their platforms.

Deputy Minister for Social Partnership, Hannah Blythyn, opened by saying: "National Hate Crime Awareness Week encourages people from all walks of life and communities to work together to tackle hate crime. It's an opportunity to highlight the help that is available and to show how important it is to report crimes like this. It is also an opportunity to educate and to support those who have been affected."

Mr Skates said: "Minister, thank you for your statement. It is hugely important at this moment in time. I'm pleased that the theme for this year's "Hate Crime Awareness Week is faith hate, and especially antisemitism, which have no place whatsoever in our society.

"Whilst we regularly talk about Welsh 'hiraeth', we must also face up to the fact that there is still too much hate here in Wales. I was astonished and appalled by the hatred recently targeted at the S4C presenter Ameer Davies-Rana.

"I think it illustrates that hatred still hides in all parts of Wales, in English and in Welsh-speaking communities, but social media gives racist, homophobic and faith-hating cowards a keyboard to spread their poison.

Online media platforms must be more responsible and indeed proactive in stopping hate crime.

"And finally, Minister, would you agree that, through the new curriculum, diversity in all its forms must be promoted and celebrated, and that young people should not be deprived of the right to be whomsoever and whatever they wish to be, free of fear, intolerance and hatred?"

The Deputy Minister said: "Every young person should have the right to be who they are and be themselves." She highlighted some of the work the Welsh Government is doing to tackle the epidemic, concluding: "One hate crime is one too many, but we must keep going with the positive things we're doing to make a difference to people's lives."

Strike impact update

As you may be aware, Unite the Union intend to continue the current period of industrial action until 24th November, 2023. With this in mind we have been working to come up with a plan for waste and recycling collections over the coming weeks.

Other things to note

From Monday, 9th October, there will be a temporary change to the collection schedule whilst the ongoing industrial action is taking place.

The new, temporary collection schedule (from 9th October) means your collections will be split in a three-week cycle where we will attempt to collect.

- Your black/blue bins and food waste one week
- Your dry recycling and food waste one week
- No collection for one of the weeks.

It's important to note that your collections won't necessarily be in this order e.g. your black bin collection may not take place in the first week, it may happen in the second or third week, which is why it's really important to always check your bin day first.

During this period, the best way to stay up to date on when your collections are taking place is to enter your postcode in the check your bin day section on our website.

Please share this info with your friends, family and neighbours who may not have seen our latest updates, or may need some support checking their revised collection dates.

Extra support to check updated collection dates is also available by calling the Contact Centre on 01978 298989 or emailing contactus@wrexham.gov.uk or you can drop into your local housing estate office.

We've had to make these changes as we continue to balance the resources we have across the collection rounds, and at present we can only offer a managed frequency of collections.

These changes take place from Monday, 9th October and override any previous communication you have received.

- Other things to note
 - Winter weather may impact on our ability to deliver the proposed schedule
 - Extra caddy liners and blue sacks can be picked up at <u>various</u> locations across Wrexham

We know this disruption is frustrating, but we're working hard to try and manage services, and would like to thank everyone for their continued patience.

While we've outlined our intentions, we're working through a period of industrial action and we need to assess available resources on a daily basis – as well as balancing demand for other critical services (for example, responding to adverse weather).

There are no results for Pick Your Own Pumpkins e.g.:

What are the ground conditions and what should I wear?

We are a working farm so the ground can be uneven and muddy. Sensible footwear is required and wellies and raincoats are advised. The pumpkin plants can be prickly so children should have their legs and arms covered.

Is it accessible for prams/wheelchairs?

Visitors with very sturdy prams/wheelchairs have accessed our fields in previous years. However, we can't promise that it will be possible as it depends on the conditions underfoot on the day.

Are there toilet facilities available? Toilets will be located near the field but unfortunately baby change facilities are only available in the Garden Centre.

Will the pumpkins last until Halloween if bought early?

If you look after your pumpkin it will last for weeks UNCARVED. Store them somewhere frost free with plenty of fresh air e.g. a shed, garage or outside. Once carved your pumpkin will last 3-5 days outside.

Are dogs allowed? Sorry no dogs are allowed on the pumpkin fields. Well behaved dogs on leads are allowed on the car park field.

Do you provide wheelbarrows?

Wheelbarrows will be available for your use on a first come first served basis. We suggest you bring a large 'bag for life' just in case all of our wheelbarrows are being used.

Do you have a cafe onsite? We will have a catering trailer down in our pumpkin fields which will be open most days. You can

also visit our Strawberry Fields Restaurant in the main Garden Centre which is on the same site.

CHECK OUT OF THE BLUE OR TOO GOOD TO BE TRUE STOP / CHALLENGE / CHECK/ THINK FRAUD! Introduction

Welcome to the North Wales Police fraud prevention booklet. In it you will learn about the current scams we are seeing in the area, as well as practical advice on how you can best protect yourself from criminals intent on getting their hands on your money.

In 2021 North Wales Police created a new Economic Crime Unit, bringing together

financial investigators, financial safeguarding officers, specialist fraud investigators and cybercrime officers, to reduce the harm caused to our residents by fraudsters.

Over £10 million is lost to fraud every year in North Wales alone, and with a significant number of criminals operating from outside the UK, investigation and recovery of lost funds can prove challenging. As such, we believe that preventing fraud and raising awareness is the key to protecting everyone in our community. If you can recognise fraud when it happens, you can stop yourself becoming a victim.

Fraudsters are constantly formulating new ways to deceive their victims and will use modern technology to hide their identity or convince you they are genuine. This means that spotting a scam isn't always easy but generally, if something sounds too good to be true, or if the contact you receive is unexpected, then it is likely to be fraudulent.

We hope you find the information in this booklet useful, and that it increases your awareness of fraud so that you can avoid any financial loss. We would also ask that you share this information with your friends and family so that everyone in North Wales becomes fraud aware.

Telephone scams 4

The telephone is the most common method fraudsters use to make contact with their victims.

Criminals may claim to be from a wide variety of organisations such as a bank, a government agency, a utility company, a computer software

provider or even the police and will attempt to manipulate you into acting on their instructions.

They may ask you to provide your personal information, including your bank details, to receive a refund or pay for something. This information can be collected by the criminals and used to steal your identity, opening accounts or accessing existing accounts in your name. This is also known as 'vishing'.

They might request remote access to your computer to fix a fault or try to persuade you to transfer money from your account into another safer account. Criminals may also offer to send a courier to your home to collect cash or other valuables, or ask you to post your bank cards or cash in the mail. All of these requests are likely to be fraudulent.

The number that appears on your caller ID may look familiar or match the number on the back of your bank card, but this can be faked and even if the caller already has some of your personal information, this does not guarantee they are a genuine caller. Scammers can keep a telephone line open even if you have ended the call. The line can be kept open for up to ten minutes, so if you need to verify a suspicious call, we recommend that you use a different line, a mobile phone or ask a friend or family member to check the validity of the call using their phone. A common tactic used by criminals is to ask for gift vouchers as payment. This kind of request will always be an indicator of fraud as no legitimate payment can ever be made using vouchers.

Although spotting a fraudulent call can be tricky, be aware of any request that is unexpected or unusual and trust your instinct. Fraudsters will often want you to act quickly, putting you under pressure to act without thinking.

Remember

- Be wary of offers that look too good to be true.
- If you are selling an item, double check that you have received full payment before sending or handing over your possessions.
- Just because something looks genuine it doesn't mean it is.
- <u>. Don't accept an email as proof of payment- if you are expecting a payment. check your account your account by logging in directly.</u>

 PROTECT..STOP/CHALLENGE

Don't make payment direct into a seller's bank account -use the the payment method recommended by the auction site you are using such as Pay Pal.

these crimes. Personal awareness around the type of crimes committed and how they occur is the first step to stopping fraud from happening and this booklet provides this in respect of the crimes we see in North Wales annually.
