



Can an Occupation Order really deny me access into my own home?

Q:My girlfriend and I had a bust up when I discovered she had slept with my best friend. Next day she changed the locks and for a week I haven't been able to get into the house we own and pay the mortgage for jointly. She says she is going to apply for an Occupation Order, which means I will have to find somewhere else to live. Surely, she can't stop me from going into my own house?

A: If you want the right to return to, stay in or exclude someone else from the home, you may be able to use an Occupation Order. Occupation Orders can also enforce rights, as well as giving or ending rights to occupy a property. They can also be used to clarify who is going to pay the mortgage and utility bills, allow you to return to the home if your partner has changed the locks, and/or to restrict someone's use of a property, for example if you and your partner must live in different parts of the same home.

Occupation Orders usually last a specific length of time and are supposed to be a short-term measure. They do not change the financial ownership of the property.

The making of an Occupation Order can be deemed as a draconian order, and therefore the Court will need good reason to grant such an Order. They are often granted in cases where there is domestic abuse. Whilst victims of domestic abuse can apply for a Non-Molestation Order under the Family Law Act 1996, that does not deal with the issue of who can occupy the property or offer the same protection as an Occupation Order does, excluding the perpetrator from the property, allowing you peaceful occupation.

The court will grant an order of occupation if it believes the applicant will suffer significant harm if the order is not made. You should make an appointment to see a family solicitor as soon as possible.





LLANGOLLEN MUSEUM

The Finds Open Day in November was very successful. Finds Officer Susie White, based at Wrexham Museum, was here to examine and help identify finds and artefacts brought in by the public. Items included a very old gold ring, a stone pendant (possibly prehistoric), the fibula of a Roman brooch and a mystery carved slate tool. Also brought in were two mediaeval hinges that we have had on display in the Museum previously. They were found in 1947 in a small ruined building on land belonging to Llandyn Hall, just below Castell Dinas Brân, and would appear to be from an internal door in a high status building. They are about 2ft long and were probably for a 3' 6" to 4' wide door. A number of experts have looked at them. One said "This is a very exciting find and could easily be from the 13th or 14th century, although there are doors and hinges in the Welsh Marches, in clearly 17th century contexts, where the design has simply not developed since the Middle Ages". Another said that "given the choice between these being c.1650 or c.1300 I would go for the latter". So are the hinges from an early Llandyn Hall, another important residence, or possibly even from the Castle itself. The Finds Open Day was well attended, we are planning to hold similar events supported by Susie on a quarterly basis. Still to be confirmed, the initial dates that we have pencilled in for 2024 are 9th March, 13th July and 9th November. It's a great opportunity to meet Susie, learn more about artefacts and maybe solve some mysteries! We hope to see you at our next open day! The Museum will be developing a Young Archaeologists Club to be launched over the coming months. Designed to give young people opportunities to get hands-on, discover the past and participate in archaeology, the group will meet monthly. There will be no museum talks in December and January, in February 2024 we will have a presentation about the Welsh Women's Peace Petition to America, one of the most inspiring 'hidden histories' to have recently re-emerged. In 1923, with the horrors of World War 1 having galvanised a whole generation against conflict, women of Wales organised an unprecedented campaign for world peace. Nearly 400,000 women signed a memorial petition through the Welsh League of Nations Union calling for America to join and lead the new League of Nations. Entry for each of the talks will be £3, which includes tea/coffee and biscuits. A new addition to the Museum exhibitions is a reproduction of a suit of Civil War roundhead armour. Coming up at the beginning of next year will be new displays on the Dee Coracle and Mills in and around Llangollen. Go to our Facebook page to see our present Artefact of the Week, which is The 'Black' Bardic Chair, awarded posthumously to Llangollen poet Thomas Jones (who wrote under the name Taliesin o Eifion) at the 1876 Wrexham Eisteddfod. Thomas had submitted the poem under the nom de plume Eusebius, but had died two months before the Eisteddfod. The poem was forwarded to Wrexham on the very day that he died. After receiving an affirmative answer to the question,



"A ydyw yr awdl wedi ei halnfon yn saff?" ("Is the poem safely sent?") he quietly succumbed to death. There is also a link to view the "Black Chair" in full 3D. We are pleased to announce we have recently been successful in getting two grants to make improvements at the Museum. The Clocaenog Wind Farm Fund has supported work to improve storage, put up signage, install a number of standard and audio displays and

improve security. The Denbighshire Key Fund has awarded money to allow us to install a chair lift up to the gallery area and improve the facilities for volunteers. The Key Fund has also provided us with further funding to enable us to purchase the Museum building from Denbighshire County Council, enabling us to have more certainty in the ongoing future of the Museum. However, securing the future of the Museum is still dependent upon replacing the roof of the building. We are presently waiting to hear the result of an application to the Community Ownership Fund and will shortly be submitting an application to the Community Facilities Programme to try and secure further funding. The Museum will close from Monday 18th December for Christmas. We will re-open again on Wednesday 3rd January, but then will be closed from Monday 15th to Friday 26th January for our annual stock take and deep clean. We will be open again from Saturday 27th January. Winter opening times are 10am to 3pm on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday.
