Does council tax have to be paid when someone goes into a care home?

Q:My mother is moving into a nursing home but we don't want to sell her house yet. What is the situation regarding council tax when she is in the home, and what happens about it if she passes away and we then sell it? Would she, or we if she has passed, be liable?

A: Council tax is not charged on a property where the owner has moved into a care home, provided the property remains empty. If you decided to let the property out, however, then council tax would become payable. In most cases the tenants would be responsible for paying the council tax.

If your mother dies and the property becomes empty whist you sell it, then it will be exempt from council tax until probate has been granted on her estate, and then up to a further six months beyond probate. If ownership of the property passes to you in your mother's Will, then you will need to pay council tax as soon as you have probate. Otherwise, the council tax should be paid out of her estate from the exempt period after probate has been granted until the property is sold.

If a solicitor is acting as executor to your mother's estate they will deal with the council tax payments. Otherwise, whoever is executor should deal with it. Similarly, the executors should apply for any due refund of overpaid tax.

After probate has been granted the local authority will require a copy of the probate or Letters of Administration before they will deal with the executors. If no solicitors are involved and you are sole executor, you will need to provide confirmation of that to the local authority in the form of a copy of the first page of the Will. Importantly, you should in the meantime keep the local authority informed about your mother's situation if it changes.



LLANGOLLEN MUSEUM NEWS

We are moving into the time of year now when the weather is testing our new roof, so far it has proved up to the challenge. Moving into November we will see the end of the Llangollen Museum Sustainability Programme, kindly funded by the Lottery Heritage Fund, Community Ownership Fund, Denbighshire Key Fund and the Clocaenog Wind Farm Fund. So many thanks to all of them for enabling us to make the necessary repairs and improvements to keep Llangollen Museum open. The new security fencing and storage units have now been put in, as has our new noticeboard (many thanks to Dave Bythell for that). Our new entrance door is presently being made, and should be installed in a few weeks and all of our windows and doors are being re-varnished or painted. Our new web site will be going live in a few weeks, and is much more mobile and tablet friendly. We are excited to announce that the first session of our newly founded Young Archaeologists Club will take place on Jan 15th 2026, with 'An Introduction to Archaeology'. Sessions will be held at the Museum from 6 to 8pm on Thursday evenings. For information please contact Gill Smith on 07516023524 or gilliansmith2@hotmail.co.uk Visit the Clwyd and Dee Valley Young Archaeologist's Club at https://www.yac-uk.org/clubs/clwyd-and-dee-valley. The following meetings will be:- The Iron and Bronze Ages, Roles in Archaeology, Myths and Legends, Neolithic Rock Art, Midsummer Celebrations and Eliseg's Pillar.

On display in our item of the month cabinet is a truly magical exhibit – a wand. It was found in a secret cache in the ceiling above the main hearth at Pentre Hall, Bronygarth, directly below a demon carved into the floor above. Possibly, it was placed there to ward off evil spirits. In the art gallery is an exhibition of photographs of Dinas Brân Castle by Jane Evans, along with historical paintings and drawings of the Castle and some photographs taken during the recent excavations there by Heneb. In November Sylvia Hikins is mounting an exhibition entitled 'Changing Landscapes', and booked for February is local Carrog artist Grace Hughes, who paints landscapes inspired by the beauty of the local area. Our programme of talks continues. Dr Pauline Clarke gave an illustrated presentation for our October talk about the Portable Antiquities Scheme and the Material Culture of Offa's Dyke. Since its creation under the 1996 Treasure Act, the Portable Antiquities Scheme has built a vast database of artefacts from England and Wales. Based on PhD research at the University of Chester, exploring what these finds revealed about British interactions with Anglo-Saxon and Scandinavian neighbours and how they help identify enduring sites in the landscape—particularly in the under-researched Marches region. Our November talk has been moved back into early December. On December 10th Gill Smith will be giving an illustrated talk on Hidden Histories and Folklore of North Wales Churches. This will be the

first of two talks covering churches from the local

area to Anglesey and the ancient churches on the Pilgrimage route to Bardsey Island along the Lleyn Peninsula. Talks start at 7pm at the Museum. Tickets are £3 at the door with refreshments provided. We hope to see you there! The Museum closes for Christmas from Monday 22nd December to Sunday 4th January We will also be closed for 8 days at the end of January (23rd to 30th), for cleaning and collection inspection. News Update

Welcome to the twenty third edition of Crane News.

We hope you are all well. It's that time of year again when we might be tempted to drink more alcohol than usual. Do you know what the maximum number of units a week is now? For both males and females, it is only 14 units a week. A pint of normal strength beer is just over 2 units, as is a small glass of wine. A pub measure of spirits is one unit of alcohol. So, if you only have a pint of beer every day for a week you will be exceeding the maximum recommended consumption. Alcohol is also a source of calories so if you are trying to watch you weight restricting your alcohol is a good idea.

There is an increasing prevalence of Type 2 diabetes. Are you at risk? When we do routine bloods for patients, we usually check your blood for this by measuring something called HbA1c. This is a more reliable method of checking your diabetes type 2 risk rather than just looking at blood glucose. There is such a thing as pre-diabetic and by modifying lifestyle we can often reduce the risk of this developing to diabetes. So, if you are asked to make an appointment for bloods by the surgery please do so and ask about diabetes risk.

Do you know your blood pressure? Do you know what is normal blood pressure for you? You can buy blood pressure monitors so that you can monitor this at home. This is often a better way of knowing what your true blood pressure is as coming to the surgery can often result in elevated readings. If you are on blood pressure tablets, we may need to adjust the dose as you get older. Therefore, it is important to keep a check on your blood pressure. With some blood pressure tablets we need to also have regular blood tests so please arrange if you are asked to.

Winter is always a busy time at A and E departments so please try not to attend and consider alternatives such as pharmacies or the 111 service. Help the NHS help you.




THE FRON MALE VOICE CHOIR HIT THE RIGHT NOTE WITH WREXHAM AFC FANS

The Fron Male Voice Choir have struck a chord with Wrexham AFC supporters quite literally by releasing two unforgettable singles inspired by their performances connected to the club's remarkable journey. The first, Can't Keep My Eyes Off You, was recorded after the choir's rousing half-time performance during Wrexham's historic win over Boreham Wood — the match that sealed the National League title and secured promotion to the EFL League Two. Fans were so moved by the performance that they urged the Fron to record the song.

Their second single, *Yma O Hyd*, Dafydd Iwan's iconic anthem of Welsh resilience, was also recorded following huge fan support. The choir had previously performed the song in an advert celebrating Wrexham's striking third shirt, a crisp white and light blue design reminiscent of Argentina's national colours. The shirt's palette honours the Welsh colony established in Patagonia, Argentina, in 1865, a lasting symbol of Welsh heritage abroad. These releases prove once again that the Fron Male Voice Choir are masters of uniting passion, pride and harmony and, that sometimes, the fans really do have the best ideas.





This is the plan of the new car park to be built at the old weigh bridge car park site just down the road from the Queens Hotel. Although just a car park this has the potential to boost our local economy and so bring more jobs back into our community. It is 500mts in either direction from this car park to both the aqueduct and Cefn Mawr Village Centre. The capacity of this car park will be 200 cars plus coaches, and this is required to help alleviate the visitor parking problems experienced in Trevor and Fron every year. It will also put the majority of parking for visitors in a central location where we can then encourage them to visit a wider area, i.e. our respective village centres and businesses.

This is the whole point of us proposing the Park and Ride Scheme between this car park and the Holly Bush Inn Bus Stop and secondly hosting the Pontcysyllte World Heritage Site Visitor Centre in the Ebenezer Gallery. This will give us a major tourist attraction in the middle of our community where our tourist information point will tell people about all the attractions, facilities and services <u>IN OUR COMMUNITY</u>.

As for our connection with the aqueduct, our forefathers quarried cut and dressed the sandstone for the pillars in Tan-y-Craig Quarry above the Ebenezer and made the Iron Work in the Plas Kynaston Iron Foundry near Gas Works Hill. So, I think we have every right to host the WHS Visitor Centre in our community. Furthermore, we once again invite WCBC and both community councils to join us in helping our community to prosper.

The PKC Group is a member of WHUK and as such we have learnt quite a lot about the other 33 World Heritage Sites in the UK. WHUK states that any World Heritage Site that attracts more than 350,000 visitors is a major tourist attraction. CRT & WCBC say that the aqueduct attracts more than 500,000 per year. So, we need to make the most of this opportunity that is right on our doorstep for our community.
